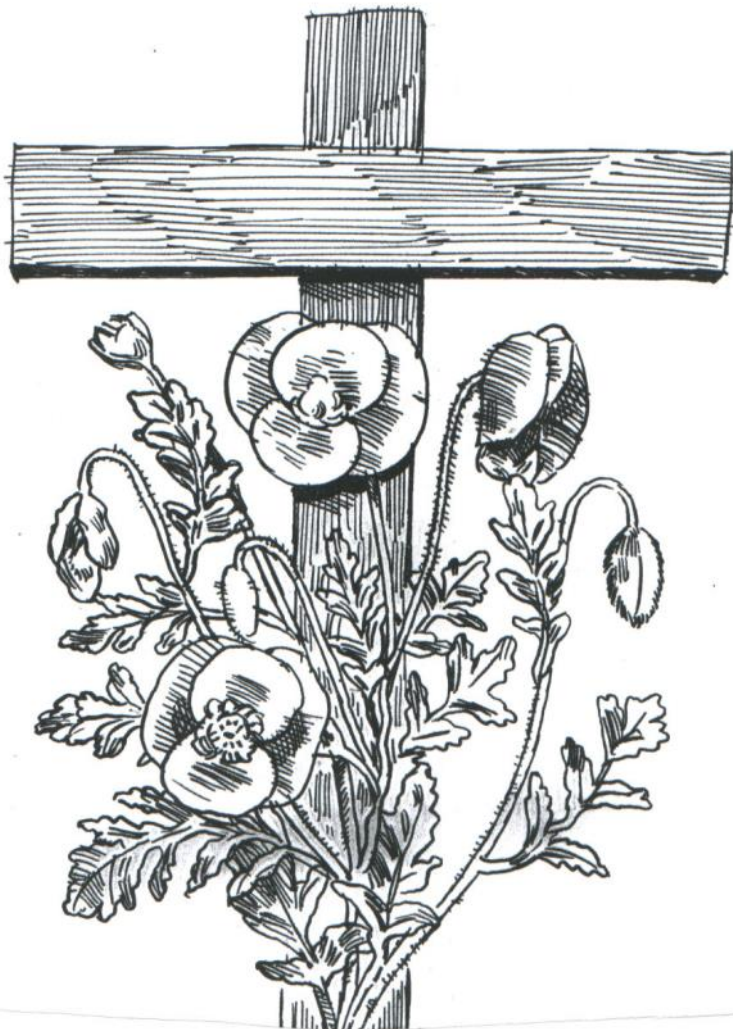

## Martin Allen writes...

There is something about humans and our desire to be remembered. It may even be one of the things that distinguish us from animals. Animals remember but I don't think even primates make memorials...

From early times we have captured important life events or remembered people. In the cave paintings at Lascaux, (<http://www.bradshawfoundation.com/lascaux/>) thought to be about 17,000 years old, we see people caring for their dying fellows and remembering them. Then there are the pyramids, partly tombs, but also testimony to the importance of the pharaoh, from around 3,000 BC.

More recently expressions of a desire to remember include the Cenotaph (1919), the Diana fountain (2004) and the Holocaust memorial to be built next to Parliament. (<https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/uk-holocaust-memorial-foundation>).

You may have a place to remember loved ones or keep something they have given you. We may choose to give things in order to be remembered or create special memories with family and friends. In this modern age we can have videos and photos to remember too.

Sometimes memorials and remembering surprise us. I recently visited a Boer War memorial I had no idea we would come across when walking the Chiltern Ridgeway. (<https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/chilterns-countryside/features/a-brief-history-of-coombe-hill>)

At 64 feet tall, sited some 843 feet above sea level it has the names of 148 men who died carved on it. It helped those who erected it

(without cranes and heavy machine plant) to remember those they had lost, gave meaning to their sacrifice, and is a fitting and impressive tribute to the dead.

We also encountered a very different memorial – *a tree cathedral*. Edward Blyth, who wished to remember three World War 1 colleagues who died, (<https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/whipsnade-tree-cathedral/features/edmund-blyth---visions-of-a-cathedral>) created a lasting memorial by planting trees in the layout of a traditional mediaeval cathedral. It is a beautiful and peaceful place for reflection and prayer.

At this season of remembering we think of those lost in conflict and honour their memory - healthy remembering. We think too of those, scarred by conflict, who would like to forget but are forced into unhealthy remembering because of trauma and illness. We may choose healthy ways to express our remembering in wearing a poppy, attending a service around a physical memorial or donating.

But what about a faith context? Is there guidance in the Bible as to how to remember? Well yes; many times the Israelites and we are encouraged to remember. This ranges from remembering the creation story showing Gods love, to guides for a healthy life (the Ten Commandments).

Jewish festivals often had special ways to remember -such as the reciting of the law at the Sabbath. In Genesis 31 Jacob and Laban remembered their agreement by building a cairn of stones.

Jesus though held lightly to remembering and memorials. His use of remembering was to emphasise things that he had already spoken of or told the disciples – and they had forgotten. So, there aren't many suggestions to build memorials from the New Testament!

What we do have though is the instruction to *"do this (take bread and wine) in remembrance of me" which we do in communion. At communion we remember Jesus voluntarily putting himself in the dock for us and dying in our place. At memorial season John 15:13 is often quoted "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."* If we, from human remembrance experiences of loss and war, can understand that sentiment how much more should we be grateful to the One who gave Himself for us all?

The things we do to remember others or to be remembered, good though they are, are temporary and fade. The best way to be remembered is to ensure that, at our life's end, we and our loved ones, can echo the thief who said, *"Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom"*. Healthy remembering...

There is also a toy area within the Choir Vestry at the back of the church, which can be freely accessed at all time through the service, as well as activity backpacks to take into the pews with babies and young children.

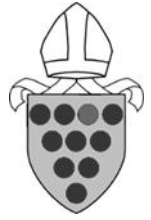
For **Young People aged 8 and over**, activity groups are usually held through in The Ark. On occasional Sundays, our Young People are encouraged to stay and participate in the full service, with alternative activities available for use during the quieter parts of the service if they wish.

We also have occasional All-Age Worship Services, with everyone participating together in a varied mix of worship activities designed and led in a way that is accessible to all: Interactive Prayer, Praise Songs, Drama and other activities relevant to the theme for that Sunday.

# Bishop's Certificate Course

On 3rd October, 2018 along with many others across the Diocese, I began a year's study of Christian learning, culminating in a presentation of the Bishop's Certificate in Worcester Cathedral on Tuesday 8th October, 2019. Followed by a celebration meal with our Droitwich group of students and Tutors.

I highly recommend signing up for the Bishops Course (B.C.), first and foremost because there is always something new to learn about the amazing life, person and love of Jesus Christ.

Our course Leaders were very welcoming, and through discussions we explored our expectations and views, sometimes relevant life experiences were shared, about times when we had turned to Christ during periods of personal sorrow or feeling abandonment, through to times of knowing unspeakable joy.

We travelled through the Old and, New Testaments, learning about the roots of our faith; re-enacting the Jewish Passover meal (Sedar), and visiting the beautiful Birmingham Synagogue, which was very informative.

If you are feeling prompted to take a closer look at the B.C. Course, trust that you will be inspired and encouraged by your fellow students, the course materials (which are excellent) and your Tutors.

As with all things, your commitment to learning (homework) will reflect what you get out.

For me, the course gave me direction - studying for B.C. overlapped with another commitment I distinctly felt God calling me to do, which demanded much of my time, so don't be put off...I wasn't.

B.C. began life as the Birmingham 3D course for Developing Disciples. Having done this course in 2009 you can see, some people choose to refresh their learning, doing it twice, even three times to *"fill in the gaps"*.

By God's grace, I feel truly blessed to have invested this year to B.C.

# Letter from the Bishop of Worcester

*Bishop John writes...*

Together with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Birmingham, Bernard Longley, I recently led an ecumenical pilgrimage to Rome, accompanied by 20 Anglican and 20 Roman Catholic pilgrims.

One of the highlights was a general audience of the Pope in St Peter's Square. There were many thousands of people at that audience, as there are every Wednesday morning, but we were very fortunate to be singled out and warmly greeted by the Pope who asked us for our prayers for him. *'Don't forget!'* he added.

At the heart of such audiences is a simple Bible study, given by the Pope in Italian and translated into a number of languages. On this occasion he reflected on the occasion recounted in Acts 8 when the apostle Philip met the Ethiopian who was reading a passage from the prophet Isaiah. As he said:

*'Yet, without a guide, he is unable to understand its full meaning. Philip explains to him how the Old Testament prophecies reach their fulfilment in Christ. As a result, the Ethiopian professes his faith in Jesus, and asks to be baptised. From the baptismal waters he emerges no longer a stranger, but a member of the Body of Christ. The dialogue in this encounter reveals to us the key to reading the Scriptures: namely, Christ. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit will strengthen all the baptised to follow the example of Philip in bearing witness to the saving power of the Gospel and bringing others to Jesus.'*

May we remember that the key to understanding the scriptures is Jesus and bring others to him by witness to the saving power of the Gospel recorded in them.



# Remembrance Sunday

Each year Remembrance Sunday commemorates the contribution of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women involved in the two World Wars and later conflicts. This year is particularly important, marking the 75th anniversary of D-Day in the Second World War.

Acts of Remembrance will be undertaken by churches and public groups all over the Diocese on Remembrance Sunday, alongside other activities to mark the occasion. On 7th November, Pershore Abbey will hold their annual Schools' Remembrance Service, where several Pershore Schools and members of the Royal British Legion and the Royal Naval Association will be represented.

The Revd Claire Lording, said: *"The children will lead the service and help us to remember different aspects of what Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day are all about. There is something very moving about people of different generations remembering together."*

On Remembrance Sunday itself, the Abbey will host the annual Civic Remembrance Service, which is always very well supported, with churches joining together with civic and community representatives. A representative from the Canada High Commission will also be present at the service, to remember the Canadian airmen who served in Pershore and Defford during the Second World War. Their graves in the Town Cemetery are maintained by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.

Then on the 11th day of the 11th month at the 11th hour, a simple service will take place in the cemetery by the Cross of Sacrifice to remember all the fallen.  
We will remember them.

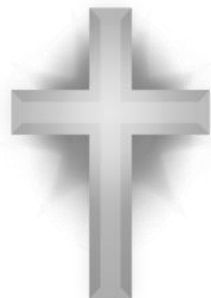
