Love is in the air....

Richard Bubbers writes...

By the time you read this, Prince Harry and Meghan Markle should have been married at St George's Chapel in Windsor, surrounded by family and friends, with thousands of people lining the streets of Windsor, and millions more around the world watching on television and online. By comparison the marriage of the future King George V to Princess Mary of Teck (future Queen Mary) 125 years ago in 1893 was a relatively quiet affair: they were married at the Chapel Royal at St James's Palace, which barely seats 100 people.

At St Laurence's church every year we continue to see the weddings of local couples wanting to commit themselves in love to each other in the presence of God and their families and friends.

A favourite reading at wedding services is the classic passage on love by St Paul in 1 Corinthians 13: *"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails...."*

Paul describes this as *"the way of love"* – and he calls it *"the most excellent way."*

This kind of love is a love which keeps coming back to an outlook, an attitude of mind in which we want the best for the other person – our long-term goal is to encourage them to fulfil their full potential and become the person God intended them to be. It is about

what you decide to do, to help make possible the other person's happiness and fulfilment. Love has been described as the multivitamin, the universal medicine for living. Love helps us feel safe, whether as a scared child getting a hug or as an adult walking with a friend through a dark place. Love is deeply satisfying, and fosters contentment. Love draws us immediately into a sense of connection. Love in one form or another is the key resource for the challenges of life.

I recently heard a hospice chaplain, who works with the terminally ill, saying that in his experience people at the end of life tend to see life *"more deeply"* – they see beneath the surface of things. They often begin to engage with the big questions of life – death, suffering, God – and often their words of farewell settle around words of love and forgiveness: *"I love you", "I forgive you", "please forgive me."*

Forgiving love is at the heart of 1 Corinthians 13 and any good and lasting relationship.

This kind of self-giving love is the love which God has for us – and we see it expressed most visibly and profoundly in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. John described it like this in his first letter (chapter 4 – The Message translation): *"God is love.... This is how God showed his love for us: God sent his only Son into the world so we might live through him. This is the kind of love we are talking about - not that we once upon a time loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to clear away our sins and the damage they've done to our relationship with God."*

May this help to encourage and affirm us in following the way of love.

Buildings Symposium

Sam Setchell Communications Officer writes...

On 13 June, the diocese will host a *'Buildings Symposium'* welcoming people from across the Church of England to look at the future of our church buildings and how they must change to survive.

Heritage Buildings and Community Support Officer, Andrew Mottram, said: *"An early outcome of the appointment of Place of Worship Support Officers (part funded by Historic England) was the recognition of the need to change the way church buildings are understood, used and managed. The recent 'Taylor Sustainability Review of Church Buildings' confirmed this need for change. However, there is still a great deal of work to be done to identify the most effective routes to success.*

Church buildings need to do more than just serve as places of worship if they are to survive the changing society in which they are located. Simply saving historic buildings because they are old is not enough; their roles both now and in the future, need to be considered from the very outset."

The one day symposium will share what has been learnt to date and also provide the opportunity for key leaders in the church and heritage sector to share their insights on what changes are necessary to secure the future of churches as places of mission. Speakers are coming from the Archbishops' Council, Heritage Lottery Fund and Historic England among others.

Letter from the Bishop of Dudley

Modern Slavery

The roadside sign to have your car washed for £3 is so tempting. With busy lives, and when time is precious, this amount is small change. You can have your car cleaned in a few minutes by a team of people, generally from overseas, while you catch up on emails or read a magazine. For many of us it's a no-brainer.

Then you begin to hear that some car washes (although certainly not all) are places where the victims of modern slavery are forced to work. Along with nail bars, brothels, domestic service and horticulture, these are the places where people are found caught up in this vile trade in human beings. The trade includes children as well, often violently coerced into illegal activity, and there is a horrifying international trade in the poorest people having their organs trafficked for the benefit of people who are ill and wealthy enough.

If you thought slavery ended with William Wilberforce then think again.

Each and every human being is made in the image of God – the Imago Dei – so anything less than human flourishing is an affront to God. Any behaviour that values some human beings less than others, or exploits or abuses them, is contrary to God's will. This is why, as Christians, we must take a stand against modern slavery in all its forms. In such a way, we follow in the steps of Jesus in proclaiming release to the captives and letting the oppressed go free.

Working to combat modern slavery is the responsibility of us all. The Church of England's Clewer Initiative is working to bring these crimes to the attention of the wider public. It is also helping us to spot the signs that are there, often in plain sight before us, if only we had the eyes to see.

Together we can make a difference and banish the scourge of slavery in our midst.





Obituary for the late Patricia Davies

The funeral of Mrs Patricia Davies was held at St. Mary's R.C Church on Wednesday May 2nd followed by Cremation in Redditch.

Pat was born in Alvechurch in January 1926 and was the second daughter of Mr and Mrs Colin Bartleet. Mr Bartleet was the Sub-postmaster in Alvechurch and Pat lived in the Post Office building and spent her childhood in the village attending the village school until she was 11 when she moved to Redditch High School. On leaving school she became a telephone operator in Redditch eventually becoming a Supervisor.

In 1959 she married John Davies who was also a village lad- he and Pat were in the same class at Alvechurch School. After their marriage Pat became Sub-Postmistress, as her father retired after 34 years service in the village. Pat and John worked together to build up the business that became the hub of village life, and also had charge of the Sorting Office and its staff of post men and post ladies, who were also familiar faces around the village. They had one son Antony who now lives in America with Alison and their three children Richard, Emily and Nicholas.

In 1982 Pat and John retired and sold the business that had been in the same family for nearly a 100 years. They moved to Callow Hill Road and before John died worked with Lorna Sage and Barbara Waller (both nee Coates) on two books about the Village and its personalities.
