# Andy & Anne Humphries Write...



Last month Philippa Brakes wrote about our "Church on the Hill" and we thought we should talk about the land that surrounds it....the churchyard, or God's Acre.

Thousands of villagers have been buried there over hundreds of years in graves covering 4 acres, making it one of the largest churchyards in Worcestershire. Churchyards like ours are a key element of Christian heritage but they are also havens for flora and fauna. Our maintenance team tries to enhance the churchyard for wildlife and make it a place of beauty and spiritual reflection for individual families and the local community. It's a natural balance between extreme tidiness and nature conservation....and always at the mercy of the English weather !

Responsibility for maintaining individual graves lies with the family of the bereaved but wider maintenance is carried out by a dedicated team of volunteers who mow and trim through Spring and Summer ...and cut back trees and hedges in Autumn and Winter. Their work is supported by local Community (formerly Probation) Service Groups who do a superb job on the difficult sloping areas along Bear Hill. The overall task is challenging ...and we're always looking for an extra pair of hands !

The oldest easily-readable grave near the large yew tree dates back to 1753 (Richard Royal), other notable graves include that of

Archdeacon Sandford, who commissioned the 1861 restoration, the Gaunt family (local doctors), the Boulton family and a memorial cross commemorating the Windsor / Clive family of Hewell Grange. Thomas Cooper, bricklayer and Shakespearean actor is remembered, as is Martha Harber - held in such great esteem by her neighbours that they produced a booklet about her after her death in 1904. There are 7 war graves in the churchyard....3 from the First World War and 4 from the Second (six of traditional Portland stone and one a family grave); the Alvechurch War Memorial is inside the church.

Most of the inscriptions show local place names....Scarfields Farm, Lightwoods, Lea End, Rowney Green but others show faraway places of birth or death....a son interred in Melbourne, Australia; a wife born in Toronto in 1857, another in Cape Town in 1867. A son born in Brooklyn, New York, a wife born and died in Charlottesville, Virginia; a man who was Chief Engineer to the Public Works Department in India.

Whether they have a memorial stone or not, or were unknown even at the time of burial (early registers have entries such as "*a poore boye found dead this morning in a barowe of Thomas Porter's*" or "*a poor walking man which was not knowne*") all have found their final rest in this green and peaceful place.

# Come on a journey

Lent is the Christian festival which marks the final journey taken by Jesus to Jerusalem. The journey that ends dramatically in his death on a Roman cross, his mystifying resurrection on Easter Day, appearances to his followers and finally his ascension.

Whether or not you give something up for Lent, you are invited to embark on a journey with other people of faith who live in the parish. All you need is a couple of hours once a week for five or six weeks. You'll meet people of different ages, from different churches and at different stages in their faith journey, and at the end have the opportunity to get together and compare notes with everyone who has followed the course.

This year our study follows four characters who meet while walking the Route San Jacques , also known as the Camino de Santiago, or St James Way, from St Jean-pied- de-port in France to Santiago de Compostela in northern Spain. It's a pilgrimage with a pedigree going back to the early tenth century, a precarious journey, that across the centuries, has been hailed as the most highly regarded Christian pilgrim trail in Europe. It still attracts thousands of pilgrims a year. Filmed on location, The Way (ICON 2011) describes the impact of their journey on four fictional characters, with diverse backgrounds and motivations, who converge on the route in 2010. It tracks their personal wrestling and shared experiences which climax at the great cathedral in Santiago de Compostela.

At the time of writing we have 6 leaders/venues open to all. Just choose your date and time and contact the leader to check details. Most groups will use the first session to watch the film in its entirety. Participants are encouraged to buy a copy of the study guide from the leader, there will be small charge for those meeting at the Lounge to cover costs and contribute to this valuable community facility.

# Not So Great Expectations

*Christopher Brazier, a former resident of Tanyard Close, Alvechurch, writes...*

Adopting a positive outlook, untrammelled by previous opinions or judgements, will open up the mind into receiving ideas about improving the quality of life. Yet why should we bother? We can't change anything! Or can we? How well are we coping with Health issues; the need for Jobs and for a variety of affordable, low-rise Homes; Poverty; and support for those who are experiencing feelings of Isolation or Rejection?

Any one of us could feel marooned on our own private island, detached from reality for whatever reason, with little hope of rescue in sight. Displaying "HELP" signs isn't the answer many would argue, as this would only make us targets for cynical exploitation. Messages in bottles, like electronic twitters in the ether, could merely identify us as lost causes in what can appear to be an expanding wilderness.


