"The Servant Queen"

On 9 September 2015 the Queen became the longest reigning monarch in British history: she completed 64 years, surpassing Victoria (63 years) and George III (59 years). This year, with her official birthday on 11 June, we celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday. When she became Queen, she promised to serve her people, and she has done so for more than 60 years.

The Queen is of course a person who attracts enormous interest: she has been described as the most famous and the most photographed woman in the world. There are many things we cannot know about the Queen, but as the Royal biographer, William Shawcross, says: *"Two things stand out – the Queen's constant sense of duty and her devotion to God. Of this she speaks humbly but openly, especially in her Christmas broadcast."*

Despite a gruelling travel and work schedule for over 60 years, Andrew Marr, the political commentator, has pointed out: *"There are no reliable recorded incidents of the Queen losing her temper, using bad language, or refusing to carry out a duty expected of her."*

Some words from her Christmas message in 2002 shed light on how we may understand this: *"I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God.... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel."*

The Queen of course has known difficulties in her family life: in a speech in November 1992 at the Guildhall in the City of London, she described 1992 as an *"annus horribilis"* – a horrible year involving the marriage difficulties of her children - and 1997 saw the tragic death of Princess Diana.

Richard Bubbers writes...

The Queen made her commitment to be a servant Queen when she was crowned on 2 June 1953: the words, symbols and rituals of the Coronation Service were devised in A.D. 973 and designed to show that the authority of the monarch comes primarily from God, and it is to him that she will ultimately be accountable. There was one moment in the ceremony which was not televised, because it was considered too sacred to show: the symbols of the Queen's status were removed, and in a simple white dress she was anointed by the Archbishop with holy oil on her hands, her chest and her head, to show that she was being set apart to serve and love her people in all her actions, with all her heart and with all her mind. In that commitment, she follows the example of Christ who was also anointed (the word "Christ" means anointed), and set apart not to be served but to serve – and in his case to sacrifice his life, so that we can have life which does not come to an end.

There is of course far more to Queen Elizabeth than her Christian faith, but you cannot understand her without understanding her faith commitment, since it is a foundational influence on how she lives her life. As broadcaster Jeremy Paxman has described it, her religious beliefs are *"quietly held", "authentic and well-known."*

At the outbreak of war in 1939, the Queen's father, King George VI was facing having to give a Christmas message in the most uncertain and threatening of circumstances. The Queen who was 13 years old at the time gave her father a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins which she thought might be helpful, and it contained the famous words given by her father in his Christmas Day broadcast in 1939: *"I said to the man who stood at the Gate of the Year, "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied, "Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light, and safer than a known way."*

At the beginning of June, a number of our curates will be visiting our partners in the Evangelische Kirche in Mitteldeutschland.

Tom Fish, curate at Lye in Stourbridge explains why he wanted to take part in the Curate Exchange with our partner Church in Germany:

"It takes a lot to drag me away from our church-planting ministry. But when the opportunity came up for a return trip to Germany, I jumped at it. I even asked if my wife Helen could come too!

We'd had a wonderful time hosting Johannes Alex from Schkölen when the group of Newly Ordained Priests came over from Germany last year. Although his context is very different from ours –15 rural parishes vs. one locally-focussed urban church-plant – at a deeper level we shared a common vision and purpose.

From the Black Country Living Museum to the Foodbank, from community football on the field to Deanery Chapter, his insights on our culture and ministry helped me to understand it better, and he too gained ideas and inspiration to take back home.

The gospel is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes, and when we see the gospel being ministered in a different culture we understand it more fully.

So we're looking forward especially to the three days we will spend with him and his family in his parish. It will be fascinating to see his ministry for real, and to renew our partnership in the gospel as we spend time together."

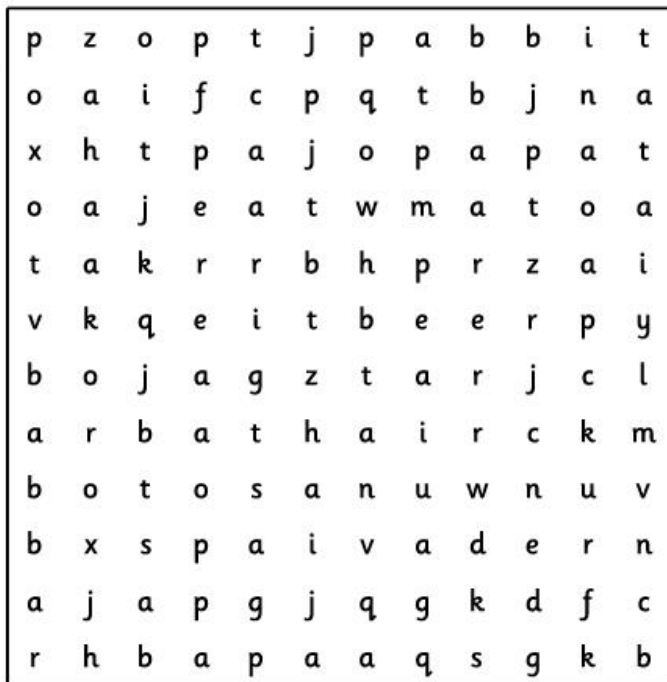

Letter from the Bishop of Worcester

During June the British people will decide whether or not to remain in the European Union. The decision is significant not only for this country but for the rest of Europe and the world. I hope and pray that people will reflect very carefully before casting their vote.

Much of the argument has centred on whether we would be better or worse off economically if we were to leave. The consensus seems to be that we would be worse.

Then there is the question of migration. Every alternative scenario for our relationship to the other countries of Europe should we leave – the Swiss model, the Norwegian model – would not change our obligation to allow free movement of people from Europe. In any event, this country has consistently benefited from immigration: Economically, culturally and spiritually.

Yet there's much more at stake than issues of economics or migration. A vote to leave could well precipitate the beginning of the breakup of the European Union. That would be very risky from a geopolitical perspective: it would make the world a much more dangerous place. That's why Barack Obama and most world leaders are so exercised about the prospect – and why Mr Putin would love it to happen.

There is, of course, much about the European Union that is unsatisfactory. It is in need of a great deal more reform.

However, even with its faults it has been described as the Twentieth Century's dullest miracle. Because of the EU, it is now unthinkable that the countries of Europe, which fought each other so fiercely a couple of generations ago, should now go to war with one another. It continues to have a hugely important part to play on the world stage. It will be much stronger with us in.

Some may feel it is wrong for me to comment on politics. To them I would quote Archbishop Desmond Tutu: *'When people say that politics and religion don't mix I wonder which Bible it is that they are reading.'* This question is far too important to be left to politicians.

As a Christian I want the world to be a safer, more peaceful place and believe that our membership of the European Union contributes hugely to that. You may not agree with me but I hope that I have encouraged you to think, reflect and pray before casting your vote if you have not already done so. For over 50 years, it has been the home of a Christian monastic community made up of brothers from many different countries, speaking many different languages and, uniquely, belonging to several different Christian denominations. Catholics, Anglicans, Protestants, Orthodox and others live and pray together, share a simple life and welcome the tens of thousands of visitors who come to spend time with them every year from all over the world.

Alvechurch Gardens only open alternate years so this is an opportunity not to be missed. Alvechurch is opening its gardens under the National Garden Scheme where ordinary people across the country open their private gardens to raise money for charity. Dean's Challenge

Throughout June and July, Peter Atkinson, is cycling 1000km throughout Normandy in support of the Friends of Worcester Cathedral.

The Dean will follow the route taken in 1897 by a famous English clergyman, Percy Dearmer, who was a follower of Ruskin and Morris, and a friend of Woodbine Willie and Lord Beauchamp. However, there is a double challenge, one for the Dean to complete his cycle ride, and one for the Friends, because for every kilometre sponsored it is hoped that a new Friend will be recruited.

Peter says: *"The Friends of Worcester Cathedral is an excellent organisation, founded in the 1930's to raise funds for the Cathedral. One of their earliest members was Sir Edward Elgar, who conducted so much of his music in the Cathedral at the Three Choirs Festival.*

"Today the Friends number about 700, but we could do with more members. So I have challenged the Friends to recruit new Friends, by giving away one year's membership at a discounted rate of £10 (it's usually £15) for every kilometre I cycle in France. My target is a thousand kilometres, which means that the Friends' target is a thousand new Friends. I am glad to say the Friends are responding splendidly, and many new Friends have already been recruited."

Recruiting 1,000 new friends will raise £10,000 and this money will contribute towards the repair of the Edgar Tower, first built by King John.
