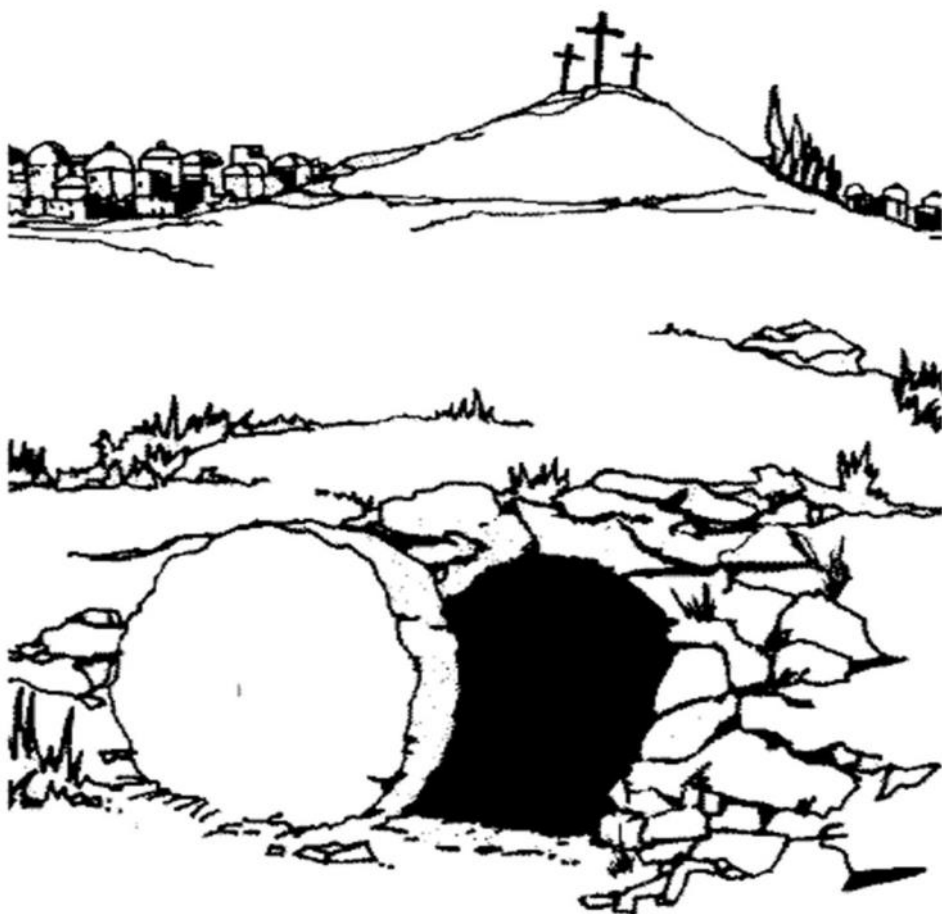

The Rector Writes...

The NHS

My dear friends

The recent report into the failings at Stafford Hospital has brought the National Health Service very much under scrutiny. All decent people have been horrified at the treatment patients at Stafford Hospital received and the ensuing high proportion of deaths that occurred there. The report made clear that financial considerations had taken precedence over compassion and care, with inadequate levels of nursing staff on the wards and a desire to meet targets rather than meet the needs of patients. Hopefully, lessons will be learnt and the same mistakes will not be made again.

Although there are failings in the National Health Service – as there are within any large national organization – I think it would be wrong to say the NHS is fundamentally flawed. The principle of providing medical help at the point of need, regardless of the ability to pay, is a noble one and one for which we can be immensely proud.

In our country we are blessed with some excellent general practitioners and nurses, who give unstintingly of their time and talents to help those in need. It cannot be easy having to deal continually with people's problems. It must be a very wearing job. And yet our local medical staff seem to take it all in their stride and provide a first-rate service to the local community. It would do no harm to express our thanks to them more often.

Our local hospital in Redditch has many question marks hanging over it at present. This must be very unsettling and demoralizing

for the staff. They need our prayers and support. The nursing staff I encounter on my weekly visits to the hospital are almost all charming and hard-working. They have a very difficult job caring for people who are not always charming and co-operative, but they seem to me to carry out their duties in an exemplary manner.

I have always considered nursing to be a vocation. No-one goes into it for the money. It is a calling to help those in need in order to improve the quality of patients' lives. Many of those in the medical profession are practicing Christians, who put their faith into action through their daily work, and see their work as an act of service for God.

It was, of course, the Christian Church that introduced the first National Health Service in Saxon times. Each monastery in Britain had an infirmary where the sick were treated. The Church was at the cutting-edge of developing new medicines and treatments for those whose lives were broken by ill-health. In so doing, members of the Church were simply following in the footsteps of Our Lord. He responded positively to the sickness, pain and disabilities he encountered during his time on earth. The medical profession today stands in an honourable tradition and deserves our continual support and prayers.

May God bless our National Health Service and all who work in it. May the mistakes of recent times be remedied. And may more men and women of Christian compassion and sympathy hear God calling them to serve Him within the Health Service of our land.

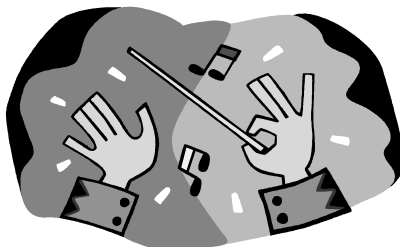
Before You Die

Palm Crosses

"Hosanna to the Son of David", shouted the crowds on the first Palm Sunday, as they tore branches from palm trees and festooned the road along which Jesus rode on a donkey.

The Christian Church commemorates this event every year on Palm Sunday, which, this year, falls on SUNDAY 24 MARCH.

At all services in St Laurence Church, lengths of palm woven into the shape of a cross will be distributed to remind worshippers how those who shouted "Hosanna" on Palm Sunday changed their shout to "Crucify him!" five days later.

There will be processions around the inside of the church and, at the 11.00.am Parish Eucharist, a congregational reading of the Passion story, in which the congregation reads the part of the crowd.

Anyone wishing to help make palm crosses is invited to come to The Rectory on SATURDAY 23 MARCH at 2.30.pm. Full and sympathetic instruction given! Please bring a pair of kitchen scissors.

The Annual General Meeting of Alvechurch Village Society is taking place in The Village Hall on WEDNESDAY 20 MARCH commencing at 7.30.pm. Once the business has been transacted there will be drinks and nibbles and some entertainment.

Do This

On the night before his death, Jesus instructed his disciples to remember him by sharing together in a meal of bread and wine. "Do this in remembrance of me", he said.

On Maundy Thursday evening, 28 MARCH, Christians around the world will be gathering to fulfil Jesus' command. In Alvechurch, the annual commemoration of The Last Supper will be held in the church at 7.30.pm. The barriers of time seem to disappear as the faithful gather around the Lord's Table and re-enact the events of nearly two thousand years ago. Was ever such another command obeyed?

At the conclusion of the service, the altar is stripped of all its furnishings and left bare to symbolise the desolation of the Garden of Gethsemane and the events of Good Friday.



Good Friday Or Black Friday?

The sombre events of Good Friday will be observed in three different ways.

At 12 noon in St Mary's RC Church, School Lane, there will be the Stations of the Cross. This consists of a procession around each of the fourteen artistic depictions of Jesus' journey from Pilate's Judgement Seat to the tomb

Then, at 1.00.pm there will be a fifty-minute service in Alvechurch Baptist Church led by the Revd. Fiona Lee.

Finally at 2.00.pm there will be a service in St Laurence Church meditating on the last events of Jesus' life – the crucifixion and burial.

There will be sufficient time, for those who wish, to attend all three services and move from church to church.

Jesus said to his disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Could you not watch with me one brief hour?"

Easter Lilies

It is traditional to decorate the church with lilies at Easter-time. Anyone wishing to make a donation towards the purchase of Easter lilies can place their donation on the plate at the back of the church. If lilies are being given in memory of a departed loved one, please record the name on the list on the table at the back of the church, so they can be remembered in the church's prayers on Easter Sunday.

Easter Eve

Easter Eve – SATURDAY 30 MARCH – is the day when the church is decorated for Easter Day. All offers of help gratefully received. The Rector will be in church at 10.00.am to construct an Easter garden. He would be pleased to have the help of any children who are able to come.

The Easter Vigil takes place at 6.30.pm on SATURDAY 30 MARCH. The service begins with the church in darkness as readings of God's powerful deeds in the past are related, culminating in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. At this point all the lights in the church are switched on and the full magnificence of the decorated church is revealed. The service ends with prayers of preparation for Holy Communion the following day.

Easter Day

Don't forget to put clocks FORWARD one hour or you will arrive at church on Easter Day just as everyone else is leaving! This would be a calamity, because Easter Day is the climax of the Christian Year. *The Book of Common Prayer* says "Every confirmed member of the Church shall communicate at least three times in the year, of which Easter to be one." Common sense tells one that not to receive Holy Communion on this day of days is a denial of belief.

There will be an early morning celebration of Holy Communion at 8.00.am and a main morning service at 10.30.am. There will be a Sunday Club in The Ark for the children and an Easter Egg Hunt around the church at the conclusion of the service.

News has recently reached Alvechurch of Alejandro Mesco's official installation as a priest at the St James' Mission Church situated to the east of Arequipa, on the slopes of the Misti volcano. The mission was established five years ago and there is now a simple building. Work will be undertaken to the interior and exterior to make it into the lively and attractive place it is intended to be.

Alejandro is currently working on processing the documentation to ensure the official rights over the land are established. It will then be time to start addressing the installation of basic utilities, which could take several months.

In the meantime Alejandro intends to carry out evangelisation among the adults and children of the area, using resources such as *Alpha* and *Christianity Explored*, together with children's materials.

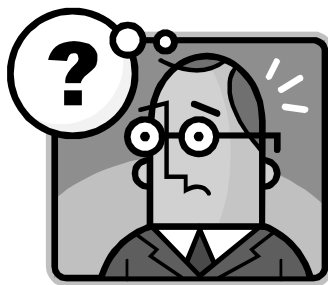

My Favourite Bible Story

This month we begin a new monthly feature in which parishioners chose their favourite bible story and say why they like it. We commence with the Old Testament story of Joseph, chosen by Sue Phillips.

A story of jealousy, favouritism, boasting, attempted seduction, broken promises involving a man of extraordinary talent, positive thinking, self-belief, trickery and faith, Joseph's story is the account a journey from the pastures of Palestine to the courts of ancient Egypt. It's a good read. The main character is the eleventh of twelve brothers, sons of polygamous Jacob. He was the long awaited first born of Jacob's favourite wife, and his favourite son. He's the boy of technicoloured dream-coat fame.

From early on in his life it was apparent that he had a special gift of divine origin, but his immaturity and a tendency to brag, coupled with the favouritism shown by his father alienated him from his brothers. Their dislike led to a plan to get rid of him by selling him off to slave traders, and covering up his disappearance by convincing his doting father that he'd been savaged by a wild animal.

As a slave to a royal official his God-given talents were recognised and he was given great responsibility in his master's household.

However his good looks attracted the lady of the house, who, humiliated by her failure to seduce him, set a trap that had him falsely accused and thrown into prison. It wasn't long before his exceptional gifts were spotted there and the gaoler made him responsible for the internal workings of the prison. Here he gained the trust of two prisoners who confided in him, each recounting a strange dream. Joseph was in his comfort-zone. His early experience of God's voice was through dreams and their interpretation. He's impressive, he gets it right, though it's a long time before the promise to reward him is fulfilled.

Eventually a need arises in the royal household and Joseph is remembered and comes to the attention of the king who is desperate to make sense of a series of bizarre dreams. Joseph's explanation is so convincing that the king enlists him in making plans to address the future needs of the nation. Once again Joseph gains the trust of a significant person, and this time he emerges as the hero of the hour.

The story then moves to his homeland where famine has struck, and his brothers come seeking grain from the vast granaries Joseph has built. The family is eventually reunited but not without drama and emotion, confrontation and resolution.

This is a story of a flawed family, of deep faith in an unseen God who remains faithful and draws the family into a plan far bigger than anyone could have imagined. It's about courage in the face of adversity, of wisdom in extreme situations and of the restoration of family bonds despite pain and injury inflicted by jealousy and selfishness. A story of myriad human failures transformed through faith into personal and political triumph. It's larger than life granted, but it contains many scenarios that we encounter in 21st Century life, and some useful tips on how to handle adversity.

You can read it for yourself in Genesis chapters 37-50 (including a few bonus scenes).

A man who was born at *The Crown*, Withybed Green and lived all his life in Alvechurch made his final journey to church in a motorcycle hearse.

Roger Augustine Edward Whitby was one of four children born at *The Crown*, Withybed Green. He is survived by his sisters, Joanne, Angela and Sheila. In 1972 he married Erica and they had six children – twins (who died in infancy), Chris, Marion, Kathryn and Holly.
