Philippa Brakes writes.....

Reconciliation

According to the dictionary the word reconciliation means restoring or bringing back to friendship. Throughout history there have been terrible wars involving industrial quantities of slaughter and acts of normally unthinkable violence and cruelty. Yet after a time, there has virtually always been reconciliation. People seem to feel a huge need to reach out to others to heal the pain that has been caused, even when that reaching out itself hurts. I believe we are meant to be in harmony with each other and anything less feels wrong and damages everyone concerned. Without reconciliation, wounds fester, resentments grow and we are unable to appreciate the joy that life can offer.

We all admire and instinctively respond to people who reach out to others in forgiveness. Just recently a family forgave the speeding lorry driver who accidentally killed a beloved husband and father. Many of us still remember Gordon Wilson who in 1987 was quoted as saying "*I bear no ill will, I bear no grudge.*" He said this within hours of lying, holding the hand of his dying daughter Marie, under the rubble of an IRA bomb. Forgiveness on this scale moves, humbles and inspires me. Could I do it?

Jesus tells the story of the prodigal son who demanded his inheritance from his father, thus making it clear he wished his father dead and gone. He then left home and spent all the money. His father must have

been so wounded; yet, when his son came in sight, on his way home in despair, the father ran, yes ran, careless of dignity, age or a wounded heart and he flung his arms around this difficult son as though the foolish and cruel rejection had never happened. That's how it is with God. Like the son, we sometimes blunder through life causing pain and damage to others and wounding God's heart, yet all we have to do is turn around and we are embraced with utter, extravagant, loving forgiveness. Having been forgiven so much and so many times, can we do less for others.

Of course, for the son and for us the turning around is the difficult part when we are in the wrong. Pride, a sense of foolish embarrassment or the thought "*This is too bad – things have gone too far*" gets in the way. But surely none of these thoughts can outweigh the delight and joy of a healed relationship with God and each other, can they?

Referring to the word restoration in the first paragraph; of course, restoration of a beautiful, broken object leaves evidence in the form of marks, showing where the damage was. Yet the object was loved enough to be worth repairing and enjoying. Likewise few of us get through life without scars, visible or invisible caused by painful events.

Thankfully, God loves us enough to repair us with our co-operation and, if we are able to perceive and understand our own and other people's scars, they can remind us of our shared broken humanity and our need for reconciliation.

St Laurence Stained Glass Windows Update

The money raised so far for the Windows appeal is now approximately £17,500 which is a fantastic achievement and all the hard work is much appreciated. On 19th February a very successful meeting took place with the new Architect, Stephen Oliver, who advised that the immediate priorities are the high level windows and gutters, and remedial work/protection for the West window.

Since then Stephen has further advised that we should be in a position to make an application to the Heritage Lottery Fund at the end of May. Further fundraising will be needed later in the year, but in the meantime, donations are very much appreciated and can be put in the carboy at the back of the Church or given to the Churchwardens or Deputies. Further updates will follow in future editions, and many thanks to all who are supporting this important project to protect the beautiful windows in our parish church.

Churchyard Upkeep

Could families visiting the churchyard not place hard objects in the strewing area. That grassed plot is for small floral tributes that will degrade, not pots, photos or small ornaments. If the latter are left on the grass or in the hedge, they are liable to be hit by a strimmer or mower, causing potential injury to a churchyard volunteer.

Could we also ask that floral tributes around graves are removed when they are past their best. If they are left when flowers or plants have died, the churchyard maintenance team will remove them, as we do get requests to do this from families maintaining surrounding plots. We apologise if occasionally something is removed before it has completely died.

Finally.... a reminder that ALL dogs in the churchyard should be on a lead. The churchyard is not a public park and we get complaints when a dog has fouled next to a grave or cremation stone from the family involved. There are now dogs-on-leads notices on all entrances to the churchyard.

He concentrated on the lesser known parts of the story, explaining how the ship came to be built by Harland & Wolff in Belfast. We heard about the people on board, both passengers and crew. After the ship sank in 1914, official inquiries were held in New York and in London, which resulted in improvements to safety standards. At the time there was great public sympathy, and a fund was set up to aid victims and their families. The fund continued to pay out until 1959, when it was finally wound-up.



A young lad came upstairs to see what was happening and then asked "*Can my friends come in?*" We found room for a dozen and they watched as we finished ringing for the eleven o'clock service. They were all a little too young to start ringing yet but perhaps in a couple of years' time

A letter from the Archdeacon of Dudley



Thy Kingdom Come

Many of us lack confidence in talking about our faith – perhaps we’re only just beginning to realise how easy it is to share a story of how God has been at work in our life with a friend, or perhaps we’ve yet to be convinced. Hopefully what we can all do, however long we have been a disciple of Jesus, is pray!

This month there is an opportunity to do this in an intentional way, praying for our friends to discover what it means to have a relationship with Jesus. Churches across the country are signing up to join a great wave of prayer for our nation to know Jesus Christ. In the week before Pentecost this year (8th – 15th May), the Archbishops of Canterbury and York have invited every church in England to pray for all Christians to be blessed with new joy and confidence to share their faith.

Many churches are considering hosting 24-7 prayer rooms. Some prayer rooms will be held across a rural benefice or deanery, others in larger churches or with sisters and brothers from other denominations and streams. There’ll even be a dedicated prayer room at the heart of Lambeth Palace, the home of the Archbishop of Canterbury. A round the clock prayer room can sound a

daunting prospect, but when I was involved in one in my curacy parish in London it was a really powerful experience, where my faith grew enormously. We’ve committed as a diocese to pray for the week, with sign up slots on the website, so you can join in from home if you can’t make it to an actual prayer room. Perhaps sign up for an hour with a few friends from your church, and pray for five people each!

There are lots of ideas about how to pray on the website: <http://thykingdom.co.uk/>, including some inspiring videos, encouraging stories and practical ideas.

In the letter to all clergy announcing this wave of prayer the Archbishops said:

“At the heart of our prayers will be words that Jesus himself taught us – ‘Thy kingdom come, thy will be done.’ It is impossible to overstate the life-transforming power of the Lord’s Prayer. It is a prayer that is reassuring enough to be on the lips of the dying and yet dangerous enough to be banned in cinemas. It is famous enough to be spoken each day by billions in hundreds of languages and yet intimate enough to draw us ever closer into friendship with Jesus Christ. It is simple enough to be memorised by small children and yet profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of prayer. When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to his glory.”

As the kingdom people of the Diocese of Worcester this prayer is a core part of our life together. I do encourage you to pray it with faith as you pray for your friends, as part of this national wave of prayer.

Christian Aid Week

This year's Christian Aid Week runs from 15 - 21 May

Bangladesh is one of the poorest countries in the world and also one of those most at risk of flooding. Each year, when snow melts on the Himalayas, the rivers swell. The water floods homes, spoils crops and ruins possessions. Sometimes, raging floods destroy houses, sweep away small children and wash away the very land on which the homes stand.

For Morsheda and her four children things have been so hard for so long, she can hardly imagine a life without fear and suffering. One year, her humble house filled up to her waist with floodwater. To stay dry, and keep away from the dangerous snakes that swam through her home, she raised her bed up on bricks. As darkness fell, she drew her children to her and prayed the river wouldn't rise further before morning. She says *"When the river rises I get frightened. This house is very low. If I could raise my house then I would feel much safer living here with my children."*

A better life for Morsheda is just six feet away. Christian Aid partner, GUK, is providing Home Safety Packages for those at risk. These not only provide the materials needed to raise a home and land to avoid flooding, but also include money to buy things that can provide a much needed income such as a cow, goats and seeds.

Pray for all our neighbours affected by floods and climate change. Pray for our neighbours who give up their time to collect during Christian Aid Week (15-21 May). Pray for our neighbours who live in

fear and suffering. Pray for our neighbours who have the power and means to make a difference.

The day will be led by the Revd David Butterworth, Chaplain for the NEC and NIA Birmingham and there will also be an opportunity to worship and share lunch together.

It is a day for all Christians, from all backgrounds who perhaps feel a call to some sort of Chaplaincy, for those who are active already as chaplains and for people who want to explore more about this part of the Church's mission.
