Richard Bubbers writes...

What is more important – winning the argument or building the relationship?

An accountant friend of mine once told me this story: there was a farmer who had three sons and 17 horses. In his will he left one half of the horses to one son, one third of the horses to another son, and one ninth of the horses to the other son. They soon realised that there was a problem, since 17 is not a number which can readily be divided into whole numbers – in this case, whole horses!

The three sons were very unhappy and became so angry that they were in danger of rupturing their family relationships because of disagreement over how their father's will should be carried out.

However, one of the sons wanted to try to find a way to maintain his relationship with his brothers, and, after spending some time reflecting on the problem, he remembered that his father had always gone to a wise neighbour, who also happened to be a farmer, when he was involved in a dispute. He took the time and trouble to persuade his two brothers to go with him and see this wise farmer, who suggested that he lent the three brothers a horse. This meant that the first son could have 9 horses (ie one- half of 18), the second son could have 6 horses (i.e. one-third of 18) and the third son could have 2 horses i.e. one-ninth of 18). This meant therefore that 17 horses were distributed (i.e. $9+6+2$), which left one horse over. The wise neighbour was then able to have his horse back, and the conflict was resolved.

We know that not all problems in life are so readily resolvable, not least the current situation which faces us as a country regarding

the European Union. But the attitude we adopt in facing such difficulties can make a significant difference, especially if it encourages trust between the parties facing the problem.

Wisdom is highly prized in the Bible (e.g. Proverbs 3.13 – 18), and wisdom is needed if we are to solve problems which come our way in our relationships as human beings. Problem solving is close to the heart of God, and ours is a gospel of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5.18 – 19). It is not by chance that in my lifetime methods of conflict dispute resolution or mediation have grown greatly in offering ways of seeking to resolve disputes (at an individual, corporate or national level) by mutual agreement, which otherwise end up in court, with the consequent costs and stress, and a conclusion being imposed on the parties.

The Bible also gives us guidance on our attitudes: be willing to forgive (Matthew 6.14), reserve judgement (Matthew 7.1), be humble (Matthew 5.5), and hold on to hope (Romans 8.24). Scripture also encourages us on the sort of action to take: take the initiative (Matthew 5.22 and 18.15), listen (James 1.19), speak with great care (Ephesians 4.15), talk with God first (Matthew 5.44), and take time over major decisions (Acts 15).

Whether we are trying to find a way through a problem as big as Brexit, or something on a much more personal level, may we remember not just what the arguments are, but also notice the attitude we have, and be honest about our own and others' motives, so that we may increasingly value the relationships which are at risk. Like with the story of the three sons and their horses, who knows what mutually acceptable solutions might then have the opportunity to emerge in the space which opens up.

Finding joy in our lives!

Bishop Graham reflects on his visit to Morogoro.

'*Bwana asifiwe*' were the Swahili words I kept hearing during a recent visit to Tanzania. It's used as a greeting and means '*Praise the Lord*'.

As a group from the Diocese of Worcester visiting our sisters and brothers in Christ in the Diocese of Morogoro, we were caught up in many times of praise. Together we sang and prayed, talked and danced. People, young and old, seemed to almost burst with joy; the women clicking their tongues from side to side in their mouths to make the unique ululating sound.

Their joyfulness will long remain with me. As we travelled around the diocese, we kept meeting people, especially in remote villages, who, more often than not, had little economic means and little 'stuff', yet had lives that were overflowing with generosity, delight, hope and joy.

This shouldn't have come as a surprise to me. Many years ago, C.S. Lewis' book "*Surprised by Joy*" opened my eyes to an understanding that joy can be found in the depths of our being. It is the pearl of great price.

Words of Mother Julian of Norwich that "the fullness of joy is to see God in all things" came back to me as I looked at the joyous faces of people eating a simple meal of rice and plantain.

I realised in Morogoro that the Western Church has too often lost its pearl and desperately needs to re-find it. We've stopped expecting to see God in all things and need to re-open our eyes.

I wonder where joy features in your life and in the life of your church?

The Gospel turns despair into hope, scarcity into abundance, sadness into joy. Do our lives reflect that? Or do we tend to wear our funeral faces too frequently?

Pope Francis recently said, "*Christians should share their joy, point to a horizon of beauty and invite others to a delicious banquet*". He went on to say that "*an evangelising community is filled with joy; it knows how to rejoice always*".

As God's Kingdom People in the Diocese of Worcester, when might you be joyful today and how might you share that with someone else?

Muriel and Neville used to keep chickens and also a few cattle, and many people in Rowney

Green remember buying their eggs from her. Muriel was born in Sparkbrook in Birmingham in 1931, the youngest of 11 children. During the war she was evacuated to Warwickshire where she lived with a family and learned her love of the outdoors. Later she met Donald Probyn who was doing his National Service with the RAF, they married and had one son, Nicholas, who was born in Solihull. They were publicans. They worked in the Birmingham area before moving to Cornwall, later returning to the Midlands. On their return they lived with family in Sheldon, Muriel working at the Rover to save up enough money to buy their own home in Wythall. Eventually the marriage ended, and Muriel married Neville Woollaston, working with him at the mill in Shirley before they retired to Rowney Green over 40 years ago.

Muriel died on 4th March and her funeral, led by Sue Phillips Wardle took place at St Laurence church on 4th April. She is buried in the churchyard along with her late husband Neville. She will be sadly missed by her family, her many friends, and the congregation of St Laurence church.
