## Martin Allen writes...

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from everyone at St Laurence. Whether you're joining us in a service or spending time with those you love; we pray this will be a peaceful time for you.

This Christmas sits between some important historical events. Recently we have had the remembrance of the centenary of the end of World War 1. Though one hundred years ago, those events have cast long shadows ever since. It is right that we remember, give thanks for the sacrifices and try not to repeat past conflicts. On the other side of Christmas we have events, which for current generations, could be as important. Brexit is not the same as global war, but may cast unpredictable shadows into the future, whatever the final outcome.

Some people in 1918 would have heard Reverend Eric Milner-White's first use of the service of Nine Lessons and Carols. Returning from bad experiences in WW1, he felt the words and songs of church services were inadequate to speak to the needs of communities damaged by the war. The simple service fulfilled his desire to offer "*Colour, warmth and delight with aesthetic as well as spiritual consolation in only the simplest and most direct language.*" This Christmas Eve the service, largely unchanged since 1918, will again be transmitted from Kings College Cambridge where he was Dean.

What form of songs and words do we need for Christmas 2018? What can speak to our fearful divided society as we face upheaval and uncertainty?

I'd like to offer some words from a modern song:-

*Do you feel the world is broken? (We do)*

*Do you feel the shadows deepen? (We do)*

*But do you know that all the dark won't stop*

*the light from getting through? (We do!)*  
*Do you wish that you could see it all made new? (We do)*

*Is all creation groaning? (It is)*

*Is a new creation coming? (It is)*

*Is the glory of the Lord to be the light within our midst? (It is)*

*Is it good that we remind ourselves of this? (It is)*

*Does the Father truly love us? (He does)*

*Does the Spirit move among us? (He does)*

*And does Jesus, our Messiah hold forever those He loves? (He does)*

*Does our God intend to dwell again with us? (He does)*

It is a baby born in a stable to a poor family who can provide us with the colour warmth and delight which can counter the fears we face. That child, grown into full manhood, is the one who can answer our questions. He can give us answers to the meaning of life, help us unite our divided society, and seek peace. Like our WW1 heroes, this cost him his life.

Understanding his teachings and applying them to life may not be easy. Doing so means we acknowledge we are in the wrong and need help. Acknowledging that, allows the barriers between God and man to be removed. Restoring that link can be a pattern for how to relate to each other. We can then truly experience "*colour warmth delight and spiritual consolation*" in all their fullness. With all good wishes that you encounter Christ this Christmas.

## Letter from the Bishop of Worcester



**The Christian faith is essentially about  
love – because God is love.**

At Christmas we celebrate God's love for us in coming to share our human life in the person of Jesus. At Easter we celebrate the depths of that love in dying for us, and its triumph over death itself in the resurrection. At Pentecost we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, '*power from on high*', to enable us to love as God has loved us.

It's as simple as that, really. The problem – in case you hadn't noticed – is that we don't manage to love as God loves us. As we celebrate the Advent of the Prince of Peace this Christmas, the world is filled with conflict. One hundred years after the ending of what was referred to at the time as 'the war to end all wars' there is still so much violence, bloodshed and oppression in the world.

Why is that? I suggest that the main reason we do not love as we ought is that we cannot, deep down, believe that we are loved or even loveable. Most of our 'sinfulness' – in Christian terminology – derives from an insecurity, a deep dis-ease within.

Ever since I became a Christian I have believed that I am unconditionally loved – in my head. The trouble is I couldn't quite believe in my heart that anyone, let alone I, could be unconditionally loved. Until I became a parent, that is. I then felt an extraordinarily powerful and quite unconditional love for my children, and still do. I spoke to my daughter about this the other day and she feels the same about her two year-old-daughter.

Now I can believe that God loves me unconditionally – with my heart as well as my head. I have a long way to go but it has made me more loving.

My prayer this Christmas is that, whether or not we are parents, we shall be given grace to believe with all our heart that God loves us more than we can possibly imagine with a love that is stronger than death and which will stretch into all eternity. Then we might be able better to love as God loves us.

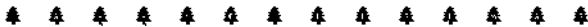

# Alvechurch WI

As this was an open evening when visitors were welcome to join us, we had a very good audience to hear Paul Harding of Discover History, talk about the Armistice and Remembrance Day. The hall was decorated by jam jars painted with poppies which were painted by the Lounge teenagers and our WI members. We also had cake, symbolic of the war with a poppy on top.

As usual, Paul took us on a journey through time, starting on the excitement felt at the start of the Great War in 1914, the war to end all wars. As usual Paul held our attention throughout. He and Helen are always welcome and we were delighted to give them a card wishing them a very happy wedding day next month.

This month several members are going on the trip to Chester; we are going to the Group Meeting at Wythall and others are making decorations for our tree for the Baptist Tree Festival.

On Monday December 10th we will be having a fun craft evening making notepads and Christmas table decorations, which we hope will start a festive spirit for all our members.
