

## Graham Clark writes...

***“Would you like to become a churchwarden?”***

That was the question put to me a couple of years ago. I'd been a member of the Parochial Church Council (the church's governing committee who look after the finances and buildings of the parish church) for a long time.

So I had a reasonable knowledge of how things worked, who did what and so on. Most of it seemed to be done by committee and there were lots of willing volunteers. It didn't seem too big a step at the time. So I said 'Yes'.

Oh boy, did I have a lot to learn!

Yes, things are mostly done by committee, and there are lots of willing volunteers but knowing in which direction to point the volunteers and making sure that all the activities of the church run smoothly is more complicated than it looks.

Thankfully there were more experienced people around to guide me. Slowly I've learnt the details: what can be done and what can't, what is custom and practice and what is governed by the law of the land. Did you know for instance that a churchwarden can arrest someone and take them before a Magistrates' Court for 'riotous, violent or indecent behaviour in a church or churchyard'; or for 'molesting troubling or otherwise vexing a preacher or other clergyman'? No, neither did I!

Just as I was starting to get the hang of all the various things I needed to know, the Rector decides to retire!

Now don't get me wrong, he's worked long and hard and earned his retirement. But why did he have to do it on my watch? And do you know who now has the responsibility of making sure everything in the church carries on and runs smoothly? Yes, you've guessed it, the Churchwardens.

Thankfully there are two of us, and we have the help of four other people so the immediate burden is spread amongst six, with the help of the whole of the rest of the team of people in the church community. The maintenance guys, grass cutters, flower arrangers, cleaners, administrators, musicians, service and group leaders, speakers, people who pray, ..... the list goes on and on.

God has given all of us a variety of skills and talents. He has put us in this place for a purpose and this is the moment when we each have to ask ourselves what talents and skills we have and how they can best be used. With all the things we are facing it's a steep learning curve, but we are not doing it alone. God is with us and will guide us in the direction He wants His church to go.

We put a piece in the July Grapevine with our aspiration that '*normal service will be maintained as far as possible*'. That is still the aim of the whole team at St Laurence. And we have had, and will continue to have, a great deal of help from the wider church with visiting priests helping with the services. It's amazing how two people can conduct a service using the same liturgy and it comes out feeling completely different.

Why don't you come along and try out something different and see for yourself if '*normal service is being maintained*'?

### Why we need to share the story

It might be difficult to believe but recent surveys show that knowledge of the Christmas story is fading.

Among 5-7 year olds, 36% don't know whose birthday we celebrate at Christmas and 72% don't know Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Among adults less than 12% know the full nativity story and 51% say that the birth of Jesus is irrelevant to their Christmas. This is a tipping point.

## Once An Apprentice Always An Apprentice

*Don Wrapson writes - from work bench to vicar*

More than fifty years ago I gave up my professional career as a Mechanical Engineer to become a vicar. I had spent five years as an apprentice and having been awarded my indentures, I decided to spend another seven years; (interrupted by National Service in the Royal Air Force) to train and get the 'know how' to become a clergyman. I could not deny I believed that I was being called to do a specific work among people for God, I still believe that to be true!

After being trained and qualifying at a college on Merseyside, I was ordained in Manchester Cathedral in 1965. At first, I worked among the disillusioned people in a Lancashire mill town. They had lost their employment due to the closure of the cotton mills. Once there, I visited from house to house on every street. The people were depressed, felt deprived and totally neglected. I worked with many young people and we built a youth centre together from a large disused chicken pen, which was relocated and restored. It became a meeting place and coffee bar. Our annual Children's Mission attracted as many as four hundred children.

After three years I moved to Wolverhampton, to a huge parish of 40000 people. Here again there was mass unemployment. I was engaged in a ministry of encouragement. Social and family problems were common on such a vast urban estate. The church attendance increased and the children and young people enjoyed the challenges that we could offer, and we raised the money to enable us to build a new parish church and hall. At this church there was something for every one. The youth wrote and performed two Passion Plays and formed a gospel singing group. Each weekend the youth club/coffee bar attracted hundreds of teenagers. Many people became Christians.

I served in two other parishes one in Derby, the other in Dordon near Tamworth before being offered the role of Chaplain to the patients, their families and staff of two major Birmingham hospitals. I worked for the Health Service for nearly twenty years. It was an exacting role working 24/7 seven days a week supporting the sick, comforting the weak and bereaved and giving hope to the dying. Often it was emergency or 'crisis ministry'.

There has always been the regular ministry to people during the highs and lows of life, including visiting the sick and housebound and conducting weddings and funerals.

# My Favorite Bible Story

One of my favourite Bible Stories is 'The Birth of Jesus Foretold' in Luke 1 Chapter 26 - 56.



God sent the Angel Gabriel to tell Mary that she had been 'favoured by God', and that she would give birth to God's son, who she was to name Jesus. Mary (who not surprisingly was troubled at first by the appearance of the angel) asked how this could be, since she was still a virgin. The angel told her not to be afraid and that she would become pregnant by the Holy Spirit, and that Jesus would be called the Son of the Most High i.e. God.

To reassure and convince her, Gabriel also explained that Elizabeth, a relative of Mary's (who had been thought to be unable to have children and was past her child-bearing years), was by God's power already six months pregnant (with John the Baptist, who would later prepare the way for Jesus' ministry).

Mary had great faith in God and accepted what she had been told with joy, which she expressed in a beautiful song 'My soul doth glorify the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour'.

I like this story because it demonstrates that even Mary (who had been chosen by God to bear his Son) was fearful at first as to what God had in store for her, but that God helped her to be obedient to his will. In common with many of us, she questioned how it was physically possible for such a miracle to happen, but her faith in God's loving power and her willingness to serve him helped her to accept his unexpected plan for her life, with joy. Mary's song has been an inspiration to many and been used in music and many different ways to celebrate the glory of God.

This story in the Bible is remembered in the Church Calendar on 25<sup>th</sup> March each year as **The Annunciation (i.e. announcement) of our Lord to the Blessed Virgin Mary.**
