

Richard Bubbers writes...

So where do our values come from?

On Netflix there is now a second series of “*Roman Empire*”, which tells the story of the rise of Julius Caesar and the fall of the Roman Republic. In order to establish his power base so that he could make a bid to become a consul of the Republic and then “*dictator*” (literally the Latin word for one person who holds supreme power), Julius Caesar went off to conquer Gaul and is reported to have killed a million Gauls and enslaved a million more. It is a graphic reminder of the cruel and callous use of power in the service of the ambition of the powerful: no consideration is shown to the concerns of the powerless unless it serves the purposes of the search of the powerful for more power, money and glory. Weakness is despised, and empathy is nowhere to be found. The values are based on power and wealth; quite simply, might is right – it is survival of the strongest. The great body of classical literature which survives from the period was of course written from the point of view of those at the top: little attention is given to the brutish and short lives of the great mass of the people lower down the social order.

Julius Caesar eventually overreached himself and was famously assassinated, but not before his name had become a byword for power: “*Caesar*” became the title for each of the rulers in the Roman Empire which came after the Republic, and it was copied by the Russian Empire with the title “*Tsar*” and by

the German Empire with the title “*Kaiser*.”

Coincidentally, one of my sons recently pointed me to an interview on YouTube with Tom Holland, a historian who has written extensively on the ancient world. He does not claim to be a Christian believer, but he speaks of his eventual and profound realisation that his moral values come not from ancient Greece or Rome but from deeply Christian roots. It was, he says, not just the extremes of callousness in the ancient Greek and Roman world that he came to find shocking, but the lack of a sense that the poor or the weak might have any intrinsic value. He refers, for example, to the absolute rights of male Roman citizens when it came to slavery and the sexual economy.

By contrast, right back at the beginning of the Judaeo-Christian tradition in Genesis 1.26 human dignity is foreshadowed in humankind being made “*in the image and likeness of God*,” an emphasis not seen in other near Eastern creation stories.

St Paul says in 1 Corinthians 1.23, “*We preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles [non-Jews]*”: the idea that God might have been vulnerable and suffered torture and death on a cross was so shocking as to be repulsive to Jews, Greeks or Romans of Paul’s day. Crucifixion was the most cruel and degrading method of execution, perfected by the Romans and usually reserved for slaves, revolutionaries and criminals. Our familiarity with the biblical story of the crucifixion may have dulled our sense of what a completely new idea this was in the ancient world, where it was the role of gods to uphold their power by inflicting punishment and not by suffering it themselves.

Paul developed this; he advocated respect for human life by declaring our bodies to be the temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6.19); and he reinforced our common humanity by showing that in Christ "*there is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female*" (Galatians 3.28).

Tom Holland likens the role and writings of Paul to "*depth charges*" being dropped under the values of the ancient world which would explode at different times in the centuries to follow: Paul's letters in the New Testament, together with the four Gospels, rather than Greek and Roman philosophers and writers, have been the significant motivators in the development of human rights as we understand them: every human life is of equal value.

In the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospels Jesus explores what it means to live the values of the Kingdom of God, rather than the values of the Empire of Caesar - where Jesus is Lord, rather than Caesar is Lord.

We will be looking at what this can mean for us today in St Laurence's Sunday morning services at 9:30am and 11:15am from **Sunday 2 September** during the autumn: you are very welcome to join us.

CAN YOU HEAR ME? HEARING AIDS

Blessing or waste of space!

Dear All, (people with aids or not sure whether you have a hearing loss!)



We people with a hearing loss come in all shapes and sizes and so do our hearing aids. We need hearing aids that fit into our lifestyle...do we enjoy music, are we active in our community so enjoy conversation, how do we cope in a group setting or at meetings, within our home do we send our friends and relationships into chaos with misunderstandings or full blown frustration ????

The answers are in the techniques we learn and the continued patience of those around us. I am sure people don't 'MUMBLE' on purpose nor do they turn away so we lose the facial expressions and lip patterns that are an important part of our communication clues....yes we admit that we do a lot of guesswork...often laugh at the wrong joke and speak too loudly. Do we want to be part of the community...not bystanders withdrawing and sitting smiling as our only form of communication? Our hearing aids are our link with the world. The loop system is a life saver as the message is relayed directly to our aids and places us on an equal footing.

This is the invisible disability. We look normal we act normal but there is sometimes a vagueness in our eyes as we juggle words, as part of a jigsaw, to make sense of the message being transmitted to us.

Fortunately we can laugh at ourselves and value the relationships that accept us as we are. So... get that aid out of the box, out of the drawer and persevere to get the most out of top notch technology. There is an excellent service on the NHS ...talk to your audiologist.






The talk was followed by tea and a selection of homemade cakes.
