## ***Martin Allen writes...***

### **Do you knit or know a knitter?**

### **Do you understand knitting?**

I have little experience of knitting (youthful attempts at "French" knitting produced snake-like woollen ropes which were impossible to do anything with) but have seen female relatives achieve amazing things with needles. Then as a young adult there was the surprise of meeting the (male) president of my University Christian Union who was an accomplished knitter....

There is something satisfying about taking the raw material from an animal and it being carefully cleaned spun, dyed and prepared as a ball. There's also the wonder (to me) in that wool being transformed by the knitter into a garment that keeps us warm and is appreciated.

You may know of the broadcaster/media person/ordained minister Revd Richard Coles. He has recently been bereaved and his husband was a knitter. In a very short moving tweet, he said "*I have just found his knitting and it has unravelled me #grief*" posting a picture of his husband's knitting basket.

I found the metaphor extremely powerful, echoing what I and others have experienced whilst gaining a new insight into what grief is like. We come from elemental things, are refined and fashioned into something that is wound together and knit as a human being by the Divine Knitter. If lucky our wool may be interwoven with the different wool of another. The two make a life together, provide comfort and can be of service. If we are blessed our relationships may be seen and admired just as a good jumper or garment.

How hard it is then when the wool gets snagged, pulled and the garment comes apart - the Divine Knitter's knots coming undone. How painful the separation and how hard to

become unravelled from the one we have loved. The unravelling and mess of the wool reflects the way we may feel in grief. There is only confusion a tangle and mess. There is no longer coherence in the thread making something of meaning and value. If a garment is unpicked the wool is still wool but is often imprinted with the shape of the knots and not as it was before.

What can we say about grief and this metaphor from our faith? In Psalm 139 we read "*For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother womb*".

So God is in the start of our lives and is knitting to a pattern long before we meet the person for whom we may later grieve. He knows us intimately and knows our future relationships and times of grief. Furthermore, the psalmist assures us that we are "*fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful I know that full well. My frame (shape) was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth*". Even in the unravelled mess he has his knitting pattern in mind.

As we journey through Lent, may you sense God knitting you with your loved one(s) and see the Divine Knitter's pattern for you. In grief may you know His ability to unravel, unpick and be created anew. Amen.

Finally all the ladies for their skill in their arranging of the Christmas flowers, thank you Ann. If I have missed anyone please forgive me. God bless.


## **Rowney Green Horticultural Society**





## Alvechurch Historical Society Museum

Anne Humphries writes...


Alvechurch Historical Society committee members have recently been discussing the future of the Museum in School Lane, a building which has housed the Society's

collection and hosted meetings for around 50 years. The building itself was originally a classroom when the village school was in School Lane and dates back to the 1940s. The Society was given use of the building in 1969 although it was never envisaged that the arrangement would last this long.

The Museum has been showing its age for some time and discussions on its future date back at least to 2009. No suitable replacement property has ever been identified and in the last 2/3 years, the building has deteriorated significantly due to the weather and its wooden construction. It is becoming a safety risk and is uneconomic to repair given its age.

The Historical Society is therefore putting a plan in place to close the museum and arrange for the collection of local archives and artefacts to be re-housed. This will mean returning some items to local people who originally donated them and transferring others to The Hive in Worcester and museums around the county. It is hoped to have a display case in Alvechurch library for smaller Alvechurch specific items.

The Society's Committee has considered the situation and future options very carefully. We know that the Society and its monthly meetings are still popular and we should stress that giving up our current home should not be seen as the end of the Society as a whole. The Committee values the efforts of its members and others who have given their support over many years. Plans are already in place to hold future Society meetings in The Ark; meeting venues will be advertised in The Village magazine, Grapevine and on our monthly posters.

We are looking forward to a trip to Tissington in Derbyshire to see the well dressings on May 21st. On past experience it should be a good day out.





## Dick Russell's Third Vignette

One of the early things I did on coming to Alvechurch was to join the Church Choir, as a bass singer. The choir-master was Richard Burman, who was also the Clerk to the Parish Council. However the week after I joined he was replaced by Lesley Armstrong-Smith. He and his wife were a recently retired couple who had lived in India, where he had been a businessman. They invited me to lunch on a number of occasions, and I remember either playing Handel's recorder sonatas with him afterwards, or going for a walk over the Lickey Hills or round the Bittel reservoirs. When, four years later, I married Cathy, in St. Laurence Church, his then recently bereaved wife volunteered to put her up on the previous night, and help her get ready for her wedding, (for Cathy had no mother or father to assist her). Her mother had died when she was still a baby, and she had no memories at all of her mother and very few of her father who married again but suffered a breakdown in health, and later died.

Going back to my joining the church choir, though, in my bachelor days: choir was considerably larger, with always a number of children being trained in it, and could attempt larger works such as Stainer's Crucifixion, or sections of Handel's Messiah, or Haydn's Creation. Among the younger generation were a number of children of older members. There were twins Jean and Jane Aston. Their father Hyram, sat next to me in the bass section. Jean is still with us, in the choir stalls, but her sister sadly died of cancer when very young. Another such young chorister was a girl Lorina, whose mother and uncle were also members. She later married Colin Bennett, and their children Richard and Annabel were to become members later, as were our own children, Richard, Clare, and Matthew. Richard still occasionally visits us and dons his cassock and surplice to sing along with us, whilst Clare directs the choir in a church where she lives. Richard was later to star as Laurence in an improvised musical called '*The Love of Larry*' which featured the martyrdom of St Laurence, to whom our church is dedicated of course. He moved away from home soon after, but sang in the church choir where he lived. He has never had any children of his own.



One has to mention here the contribution made to the choir by John Hanks whose numerous progeny over some years fed the choir with a steady stream of child soloists, he himself also was a tenor soloist.

Sadly, the policy, on re-introducing a Family Service, after a considerable lapse, was that children no longer were to be admitted to the church choir, as a result of which we have recruited few new choristers. This has been repeated across the Church of England, and by the National Curriculum, the result being that 4-part singing is dying out across the country, except in cathedrals, music colleges and universities, as has the supply of organists to lead them. So too has the String Quartet, the most intensely moving form of serious music for over two centuries, become neglected by audiences and attracts few amateur players today. So I end this month's contribution on a rather a sad note; G flat, perhaps!

## Funerals and interments

In last month's edition of The Grapevine my wife, Sue Phillips Wardle, wrote about funeral services at St Laurence Church and the pastoral care that can be made available to close relatives of the deceased. It goes without saying that the death of a loved one, whether expected or totally unexpected, is likely to be a traumatic experience for their closest family and friends. My task, on behalf of the P.C.C. and Rector, Reverend Richard Bubbers, is about making the arrangements for a church service, and/or a burial or ashes interment in the churchyard as straightforward and stress free as possible. I thought it might be useful to explain just what that process is and how we can help.

The formal notification of the death of a loved one can be received from a close family member, a Funeral Director, or the Executor of the deceased persons Will. This can be by telephone on the church's landline, 0121 445 1087 (with an answer-phone facility), or by email at - [stlaurencechurch@yahoo.co.uk](mailto:stlaurencechurch@yahoo.co.uk)

Further details can be obtained via the church website.

Usually a request for a funeral service and burial or committal for cremation, or in some cases the interment of ashes following a committal service at a crematorium, is received from a local Funeral Director. Once a request is received the following actions need to be taken:-

1. To identify a preferred date and time for the service.
2. To check the availability of the church.
3. To establish who is to conduct the service.
4. To organise a Church Warden to be present to assist with the service.

5. To arrange for an organist and, where required, the church choir, to provide appropriate music.
6. To deal with a request for the church bells to be rung.

While every effort is made to ensure that the service takes place on a date and at a time most convenient to the deceased persons family, this is not always possible and it may take several days for details to be finalised. The service will be conducted by the Rector, Reverend Richard Bubbers, or Sue Phillips Wardle, who is one of our Lay Ministers. When both are unavailable, occasionally we can call on the assistance of clergy from a neighbouring parish. It is perfectly in order for the service/interment to be taken by a minister of another Christian denomination, with the prior agreement of the Rector.

It should be pointed out that a request for a burial or ashes interment in the churchyard, can be met provided the deceased lived in the parish of Alvechurch at the time of their death, or previously for at least 2 years. In other circumstances, please refer the matter to us.

Requests for headstones to be erected are dealt with by a churchwarden who should be contacted by using the church landline or email. There are local regulations over the type and style of headstones/ plaques and most of the stonemasons in the area are aware of these and will be able to advise you accordingly.

It may also be useful to point out that although many people have Funeral Plans with specific Funeral Directors, it is not possible ahead of time to book a particular grave or plot within the churchyard.

## **ST Laurence Church, Alvechurch**

*Maintaining churchyard plots -  
requirements of the Parochial Church Council*

### **INTRODUCTION**

The Diocese of Worcester has issued a booklet, *Churchyard Memorials - A guide for the bereaved*, which shows what a gravestone and monument should look like, what wording it should contain and the process by which approval can be obtained. The booklet (which includes an application form) is available from local funeral directors and monumental stonemasons.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) uses this booklet as the basis for approving headstones on plots. Many gravestones predate the latest version of this booklet but their existence cannot be used as a precedent.

### **PLOT MAINTENANCE – YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES**

**FAMILY RESPONSIBILITIES**....maintenance of graves and gravestones is a family responsibility which includes ensuring that headstones and plinths are safe and secure. St Laurence's churchyard volunteers are responsible for the maintenance of wider grassed areas, trees and pathways in the churchyard.

**GRAVE SURROUNDS**....kerbs around graves are NOT permitted whether solid stone, wood, plastic, loose stones or any other material. Chippings or gravel must not be used on any plot, as they can be dangerous when mowers or strimmers are being used nearby. The PCC reserves the right to remove these materials from a plot to enable safe maintenance of the churchyard.

**POWER TOOLS**....mowers and strimmers must NOT be used to maintain plots or their

surrounds. Hand tools should be used to prevent damage to surrounding headstones.

**PLANTING** ....trees or large shrubs must NOT be planted on any plot. Small plants are acceptable but must be kept tidy.

Flowers, wreaths and other floral tributes should be removed when they have died.

**PRECEDENCE**....the existence of grave surrounds, trees or shrubs on older graves or elsewhere in the churchyard cannot be interpreted as a precedent.

**CHURCHYARD WASTE**.....there are clear notices by the bins advising on the disposal of waste material. No plastic bags should be left outside the bins as this encourages birds and wild animals. The bins should not be overloaded as this damages them. St Laurence is part of the Cleaner Greener Alvechurch initiative and all recyclable material should be taken home for recycling as the Church is unable to do this.

**DOGS**....are welcome in our churchyard but they MUST be kept on a lead and owners must pick up after them. Horses must not be ridden or walked in the churchyard.
