seems so long ago and different to modern warfare, with terrorism and drones targeting the guilty but harming the innocent. My grandfather would have been horrified that the peace he fought to win could be so easily broken on the cities’ streets by people claiming to serve a deity or political party.

To counter the gloom I hope some of the media attention will be centred on the “HOPE” campaign. Begun in 2006, this now annual initiative has linked churches and communities together across denominations. It helps people think about “fresh HOPE” at the start of a new year and brings the BIG HOPE of Easter to people’s attention. Volunteers bring HOPE to people on the streets whilst helping people explore faith in HOPE courses. It celebrates the wonderful HOPE we find in Jesus’ birth at Christmas too! In 2014 they have a focus on remembering 1914 through a campaign “Greater love”. Events are being planned for 4/8/14 the 100th anniversary of war outbreak and I look forward to their creative ideas.

The title is from John 15:13:-

*“Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one’s life for one’s friends”.*

My prayer for 2014 is that our young people will not need to lay their lives down for their friends. I pray they may know the true HOPE in their lives that our Saviour Jesus, the inspiration for the verse, brings.

## Alvechurch Historical Society

At our December meeting Mr Ray Sturdy told us about Isambard Brunel who was born in 1806 at Portsea; son of a great French Engineer Marc and an English mother.

Historians claim that he was a genius born before his time. By his teens he was helping his father in calculations and equations and together they overcame great obstacles to build the first tunnel under the River Thames. He went on to build many great landmarks that are still in good working order today: The Bristol Suspension Bridge, The Saltash Suspension Bridge, Crystal Palace, Great Western Railway to name a few and also steam trains, and the SS Great Britain, a ship using sails and steam which cut the time to cross the Atlantic by half. He died in 1859 aged 53. The hull of the SS Great Britain was brought home to Bristol from the Falkland Islands in the 1970's and restored to its former glory and is now a tourist attraction in Bristol Docks. A great man.

Villa Ecológica – Arequipa - Perú

Approaching his First Christmas in Villa Ecológica, a shanty town on the edge of Arequipa, Alejandro has sent us the following update.

In many ways it has been a difficult year; however some small changes to the fabric of the Santiago Apostol mission chapel have made a big difference. We now have electricity for lighting and have just been able to put glass in some of the windows, which means that the building will no longer be very cold for the evening services.

As we come to the first Sunday of Advent, the start of a new year in the Church calendar, we are looking forward to seeing more people come to our services.

We expect to know more in the next few months. This is how slowly things move in Arequipa.

Sister Sue, we are always thinking about you and our brothers and sisters at St Laurence, please give our greetings to them all, and may the Lord bless you with a new vicar.

Here in Arequipa we have lots of sunshine, but I expect it's really cold where you are. I think a cup of hot chocolate will help you ward off the cold!

# My Favourite Bible Story

PSALM 139 – My favourite.



Being a somewhat flighty individual, I sometimes find the beginning of psalm 139 a little scary! I mean according to the psalmist there is no escape from God – “*you are familiar with all my ways*”....“*Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?*” Heck! You mean he knows everything about me?!! But then it starts to get rather exciting –

*“If I go up to the heavens, you are there: If I make my bed in the depths you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me; your right hand will hold me fast.”*

So whatever I do, wherever I go, he is with me; not judging or punishing after all, but protecting and guiding. Good to know he’s there if I really hit the depths too. Most people seem to panic if we suddenly fail to respond “I’m fine thanks” in reply to the usual, casual British greeting; but not God. He doesn’t just want to know, he already knows just how I’m feeling and he doesn’t run away – he listens!

Then comes the really good bit:

*“For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother’s womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made.”* What, me? Yes me – and you too!

*“When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, your eyes saw my unformed body. All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.”*

We are safe because God has known us from before our mothers were aware we existed. He knows every single tiny detail about us and - THIS IS THE GOOD BIT – It doesn’t matter what we have done; what we have been - He still loves us! How amazing is that?

The psalm ends; *“Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.”*

Whatever we have been and done, God is with us, loving us and, if necessary, helping us to change. Good news I think.



# Obituary

## Colin James Davies



Colin was a man of many talents, skills and interests. His sudden death after a heart attack on 30<sup>th</sup> October was a shock to everyone who knew him. He had recovered from a cancer scare a few years earlier and was rebuilding his life. During the year he enjoyed three holidays, one was at his favourite holiday resort in Malta.

Colin was born in Rubery in 1935 and went to Turves Green School. After leaving school he trained as an apprentice tool maker at Heavy Duty Alloys and later worked for several local companies.

At 21 he was conscripted into the Royal Air Force for his National Service. He enjoyed several hobbies and excelled in water colour painting. He also enjoyed music and attended many classical concerts in the village and beyond. As was evident at his funeral service on 18th November, he had a wide circle of associates from the world of sport. He had at one time been a highly regarded football and tennis coach here in the Midlands.

Those he taught in their early years remained his friends or belonged to his 'extended family'. He was also a member of Bromsgrove Bowling Club.

In the village, where he had many more connections he was known for his acts of kindness and neighbourliness. He would help anyone. An unassuming man he was there whenever anyone needed him.

Colin was an active member of the St. Laurence Church family, having reaffirmed his faith a few years ago at his Confirmation. He attended the evening service every Sunday and was a sidesman. Colin never married. He had planned his own funeral service requesting that it should be a celebration of his life. It included a tribute given by Catherine Cooke, to whom he had taught the skills of tennis.

At the service two hymns were sung: *How great Thou art* and *Thine be the Glory* and the church choir sang *The Nunc Dimittus*.

Colin leaves behind an elder sister Thelma, and six nieces and nephews and their children and three cousins. The Revd. Don Wrapson conducted the funeral service at the church, and the committal was at Redditch Crematorium.
