Is Easter important?

By the time you read this, we will probably have just celebrated Easter. I wonder what Easter means to you? Is it simply an opportunity for a long weekend near the beginning of spring, with some chocolate eggs and hot-cross buns? Or is it of greater significance and importance? Does it have anything to say about the reality of the universe in which we live?

What strikes me when I watch the Star Wars movies is the idea that there is a reality in the universe which is deeper than our senses can understand, a reality which underpins everything and impinges on everything: there is a "force", which is beyond what we can see and touch, and which affects our daily lives now. But these films show the "force" as impersonal, morally neutral, and able to be manipulated; and the extent to which it will or will not "be with you", depends on the genes and the training you have.

This picture is radically different from the personal, righteous, and unmanipulatable trinitarian God of the Bible. In general, before the biblical revelation humanity did not expect love from God, or to be invited to love God in return. Even today most humans feel that God's love and attention must be earned, and this can be a deep source of resentment. Often people are still into fearing God and trying to control God instead of loving God. They never really think that mutual love is possible, given the inequality of bargaining power. When one party has all the power — which is most people's definition of God — all you can do is fear and try to control.

The only way fear can be dispelled is for God, from God's side, to change the power equation, and invite us into a world of mutual

love and vulnerability. This is where Easter comes in, and why it is so important: our living image of that power change is called Jesus. Through his life, death and resurrection, God took the initiative to overcome our fear and our need to manipulate God, and made honest loving relationship with the divine possible.

This unthinkable relationship is already planted in human consciousness with the Old Testament idea of "covenant love". There are five words to describe God which, as Walter Brueggemann says, keep on appearing in the Hebrew Scriptures: this God that the people of Israel discovered is consistently seen to be "merciful, gracious, faithful, forgiving, and steadfast in love."

Jesus, through his teaching (for example, in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew Chapters 5 to 7) and the way he lived, embodied these values and characteristics (he called it the Kingdom of God) - and, more than that, he backed this up by allowing himself to be vulnerable in the most profound way, through submitting to a totally unjust trial and unspeakably cruel execution at the hands of the religious and political leaders of his day. This is what we remember on Good Friday.

The good news of course is that the Easter story does not end there: it goes on three days later to Easter Day when we celebrate Jesus' resurrection – he was raised from death to life: God is alive, and proactively working out his purposes in time and space, in your life and mine.

Easter announces the good news of Jesus' cosmic victory on the cross over death and all that is wrong in the universe. A new era opens up the possibility of you and me being able to know God for ourselves. This relationship does not have to be earned or deserved: it only has to be received.

May the Lord be with you.



Buildings, Fabric and Churchyard Team

Since the last update in the November Grapevine, the team have been hard at work attending to the most urgent repairs and maintenance highlighted in the Quinquennial Inspection, engaging specialist contractors where needed.

The most important jobs in maintaining our beautiful church and the Ark are keeping the guttering and Down-pipes clear, and the heating working. Repairs to the large heating pipes in the church are underway, and the down-pipe on the west wall of the church (which tends to block) has been cleared, with a new access point introduced for easier maintenance. Boiler services have been carried out, the floor and wall heating grills in the Ark have been cleaned out and fixings checked, and the radiator in the Ark foyer repaired. Unfortunately we have now found leaks in the church boiler room roof and in the choir vestry, so these are the next priorities.

We are fortunate in having been able to establish a new Project Group which, with the help of the church Architect, will be planning and overseeing the larger pieces of work, including the Stained Glass Windows conservation project and repairs to the Tower Roof and South porch.

Winter is a quieter time of year for the churchyard, but a new bin has been installed in the lower churchyard, and the consultation on the two unstable memorials in the churchyard (as advertised in the Village magazine, the Grapevine and on the memorials themselves) has been undertaken and closed at the end of March. This work will now be taken forward with the guidance of the Diocese.

With thanks to all those volunteers who help maintain the church, the Ark and the churchyard in any way, however small. Any offers of help (practical or financial) with the maintenance of the parish church and churchyard are much appreciated.

The March meeting had to be cancelled when the "Beast from the East" travelled through Alvechurch, leaving the hut without water and the car park slippery with ice. However by the time of our April meeting spring will surely have arrived, with the Spring Equinox, the beginning of British Summer Time, and Easter Sunday all being behind us.

The next two meetings both fall on bank holidays, Monday 2nd April (Easter Monday) and Monday 7th May (early May). Our guest speaker at both these meetings will be Ron Gallivan, who will be presenting an in-depth look at the Mulberry Harbours. These were prefabricated portable harbours developed by the United Kingdom during the Second World War to facilitate the rapid offloading of cargo onto beaches during the Allied invasion of Normandy in June 1944. The April talk will be about "The Design and **Development of the Mulberry Harbours**", and the May talk will be about "The Delivery and Operation of the Mulberry Harbours". Either talk can be enjoyed on its own, so do come along if you can only attend one of them, although both talks will give a more complete picture of events.



Our meetings are held on the first Monday of the month, at 7.45pm, in the museum hut on School Lane. Parking is available behind the Catholic Church, with their kind permission. Visitors are always welcome, just come along, or contact our chairman, Anne Humphries on 0121 445 5955.

Pulling Out All The Stops at St Laurence

On **Saturday, 12th May** the organ at St Laurence Church, Alvechurch, will be taking centre stage when Keith Hearnshaw, who has performed internationally, gives a recital. Margaret Haste, the organiser, said that the idea had come to her when visiting the small church on the Baddesley Clinton estate. "There, outside the entrance, was a sign advertising monthly organ recitals and I thought, if they can do this, why can't we? We have a very fine organ at St Laurence which, sadly, hardly ever gets the exposure it deserves".

She said the theme will be The Best of British and will feature some of our major composers, including Elgar; William Walton; Eric Coates and Handel. "I know the latter wasn't British but he was a great anglophile and, of course, composed some wonderful works for the court of George III. The theme was inspired by the fact that this year is the centenary of not only the end of the first world war but also the first victory in the fight for female emancipation so what better way to mark this than with some stirring British music".

There will be a bar, opening at 6.45pm and the concert begins in the church at 7.30pm. Tickets will cost £10 (children free) and can be purchased on the door.


