Alison Smith writes... Worth The Wait

Just a few weeks ago, it seemed that we had been waiting forever for the rain and cold to end, but then one day there were snowdrops in the churchyard, then daffodils all around, trees and shrubs in bud, and suddenly spring is here! Even when times are difficult, this does help to put joy into our hearts, and we thank God for the beautiful earth he made for us.

Waiting patiently is a hard thing to do. Since the Rector retired last summer we have been waiting whilst the proper processes of appointing a new priest for our parish take place, whilst doing our best to carry on as usual. This has been a challenge for the Churchwardens and Readers in particular and all those who have been helping and supporting them. We have all needed to pray a lot and wait for God's guidance along the way, and this continues as we move nearer to a new priest being appointed for our parish.

As we all know, Easter was 'late' this year, so there has been a need for patience here too. Lent is an important time for reflection, so that at Easter we can really REJOICE! As the Bishop of Worcester John Inge said in his Easter message:

'Christians believe that, because of the resurrection of Jesus, death is not the end. Because Christ was raised from the dead, we too can be raised from the dead if we wish to accept God's invitation to eternal life through Jesus. The resurrection of Jesus can seem unbelievable. For two thousand years, though, it has given millions of people all over the world a kind of hope which nothing else can offer.'

Looking forward to the summer, the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby is inviting people to plant poppy seeds on April

30th (or as soon as possible after) 'to remember the terrible events of the First World War and as a sign of our hope in Jesus Christ for peace in the future.' The tradition of selling poppies began as, and remains, a way to remember the people who had given their lives for peace and freedom, and raise money for the ex-Service community. The idea of this 'centenary campaign' is that, if the seeds are planted now, the poppies will be in flower on and around the anniversary of the start of the war, 100 years ago on July 28th. If you would like to and are able to take part, packs of Flanders poppies are on sale and can be bought at B&Q for £2, with a pound being donated to the Royal British Legion.

Following on from one lovely wedding in February, the month of May sees the start of the main wedding season, with many more couples being married this year in our beautiful church and in the sight of God. May we wish them all a fantastic day, and a happy life together with God's blessing.

Have You Got Your New Priest Yet?

Sue Phillips writes...

I've lost count of the number of times I've been asked that question. But if you are one of the people who hasn't recently asked me, here's the answer. Not yet!

But the advert for the post is now out. The closing date is 6th May and interviews are scheduled for mid-June. That's the timetable.

As ever the more interesting information lies in the detail. The person whom we are looking for as our new parish priest will need to be very special. While he or she will be living in the rectory on School Lane, only 50% of their job will be in the parish. The other 50% will be spent as a workplace chaplain in Redditch's industrial scene.

Until David Martin's retirement, Alvechurch was one of the few parishes in Worcestershire to have its own priest appointed solely for duties within the parish. Most of our neighbouring parishes have moved into what is known as a Team Ministry, where a group of clergy cover a number of churches, each meeting the needs of their congregations and community according to their gifts, interests and time available. Indeed clergy from local teams have played a significant part in enabling us to maintain our regular pattern of worship at St Laurence. Our parish now joins the number of those who share their 'vicar' with others, but for us the sharing will be with the ecumenical organisation, Faith at Work in Worcestershire (FWW) who work as chaplains to local industry and commerce.

A small group of members of the church, we call them the Task Team, have been working on the documentation that will be used to tell a prospective candidate about our parish and our church. That's called the Parish Profile, and the first copy of this has been on our website and in Alvechurch Library since before Christmas. Well now there's a new version which also describes our new partners. For the past 3 months FWW and St Laurence task team have been getting to know each other. There's a lot to learn, and we'll be doing more to introduce some of the FWW people to our community over the next couple of months.

Meantime you can look at the profile on our website, or browse a copy in the Library, and please join us in praying for all who are attracted by the challenge, that amongst them we may find the best person to take on this dual role in our community.

The *Scapegoat* is the first biography ever written about one of Britain's most marginalised military figures. In 1914 Rear Admiral Sir Christopher Cradock known as Kit, was held responsible for the worst naval disaster for 100 years, The Battle of Coronel, in which he and 1660 men died. The man who led the charge against Cradock, in a bid to save his own reputation, was First Lord of the Admiralty Winston Churchill. Steve's book sets out to challenge the premise that Kit Cradock was to blame. For a century Kit's story has been untold; for the first time it is revealed in a biography which aims to right a longstanding wrong and presents a fresh view of a man maligned by history.

Steve has undertaken extensive research into what happened at the Battle of Coronel and believes that his book will show that Rear Admiral Sir Christopher Cradock was a hero. After 20 years of in-depth research, including talking to Kit's only living relative and accessing many previously unseen papers, Steve's book challenges the official version of events.

St Laurence Church Choir

We don't know when a choir first sang in our church to lead the congregational singing, but we have music in the cupboard going back to the 1890's (some of it marked as belonging to Hopwood church and some from Rowney Green). There are one or two pictures of the choir of earlier times in the Alvechurch Past and Present books.

We are told that in the 1930's St Laurence Church Choir was invited to sing for the BBC, but the Rector of the time thought he might lose his best singers, and vetoed it! We were, however, recorded and appeared on TV on the occasion of the late Harold Fenn's celebration of 70 years in the choir. That, we think, was in February 1995.

The longest serving member of the present choir has been a chorister here for 50 years. She, and others, can tell us about many of our predecessors. Come and have a look at the plaques on the backs of the choir stalls, where you will find the names of some of them.

Now, as then, we exist to lead the singing in the services. There are 12 of us, not all able to attend every service, but each attending as often as we can.

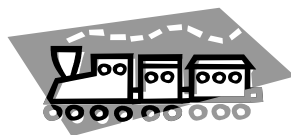
We practise in the church every Thursday evening, and sing an anthem every week. We have a repertoire of over 50 anthems, ranging in date from the 14th to the 21st century.

Forget-Me-Not Group

Anita Walker writes...

In 2011, I moved to Alvechurch with my husband, who has early onset dementia, to be close to family for support.



Eventually, after a long struggle and in stressful circumstances, it was decided that my husband needed full time care in a residential home. So in 2013, I found myself bereft and very lonely. Family works full time and, apart from neighbours I had had no time to make friends in the village.

Outside help was needed and sought. I found the Forget-Me-Not group advertised in the Village magazine offering support for those who have suffered bereavement or loss. Sue Phillips met me in my home, offering friendly advice and help. I joined the Forget-Me-Not group along with a few other new members. It was so much easier to talk and listen to others in a similar situation to myself.

Since meeting up with the group last year, not only have I joined pilates sessions and an art group with other members, but we have been out and about as a group.

One member of the group, an ardent and knowledgeable ornithologist, arranged a visit to Upton Warren. After an enjoyable pub lunch, we trekked to the bird hide armed with telescopes and binoculars and were able to identify and study many species of water fowl. Eventually we ended up in Webbs Garden Centre for coffee and cake.
