

## A NEW BISHOP FOR WORCESTER

Downing Street has announced that His Majesty the King has approved the appointment of Hugh Nelson as the 114th Bishop of Worcester.

Bishop Hugh is currently the Bishop of St Germans in the Diocese of Truro, a position he has held since 2020, serving as the Acting Bishop of Truro from Sept 2023 until May this year. He is also Bishop to the Armed Forces,



providing spiritual and pastoral leadership to Anglican Chaplains serving in the Royal Navy, British Army and Royal Air Force, a role which he will continue to hold as Bishop of Worcester.

Ordained in 2008, Hugh served his curacy in six rural parishes in East Kent before serving for eight years as the parish priest of Goudhurst with Kilndown, two village churches in the Diocese of Canterbury. Before ordination, Hugh spent 13 years living and leading the community of L'Arche London, part of an international network of ecumenical Christian communities where people with and without learning disabilities share life together.

#### Bishop Hugh said:

"It is an enormous privilege to be appointed as the next Bishop of Worcester. I am so looking forward to joining you in Worcestershire and Dudley on your journey as Kingdom People; getting to know the different communities across the Diocese and finding out what God is up to in its villages, towns and cities."

"The Diocese of Worcester is full of so much that is good and holy, with plans to double the number of young disciples, to create 100 new worshipping communities, to renew churches right across the area and to underpin all this by resourcing clergy and lay leaders. And all of that building on the faithful, generous service of people in churches of every size, tradition and place from Dudley to Bredon, and from Malvern to Redditch."







## BE SPACE: A PLACE TO SIMPLY BE

At St Laurence Church, we've created a new space that is already welcoming and alive—a place where everyone can engage with worship, faith, and community in the way that suits them best. The Be Space, located in the side aisle near the organ pipes, is designed for movement, creativity, fidgeting, wondering, and simply being.

With a clear view of the service via the screen and side view, the space is equipped with creative materials, tactile resources, soft furnishings, and thoughtful layouts that make it accessible to children, families, and adults alike. It's a space where you can draw, fidget, wiggle, reflect, or just take a quiet moment, all while still being part of the wider worshipping community. The basket of coloured overlays and fidget items provides additional support for sensory engagement, helping those who may find certain environments overwhelming or challenging to feel included, supported, and valued.

The Be Space is more than just a physical area—it is a celebration of difference and diversity. Inspired by our journey with Inclusive Church, it recognises that each of us is fearfully and wonderfully made, with unique ways of being, thinking, and experiencing the world. Some worship best through quiet reflection; others through movement, touch, or creative expression. Here, there is no expectation or pressure—just freedom to engage in the way that nourishes your spirit.

This space also reflects our understanding of God's presence. God meets us where we are, embracing every form of curiosity, creativity, and expression. Be Space reminds us that worship is not limited to one way of engaging—it is alive in every movement, every doodle, every whispered prayer, and every shared smile. Here, in the midst of colours, textures, and soft furnishings, we encounter God through our senses, our imaginations, and our community.



Harvest isn't just about crops; it's about recognizing and celebrating the abundance in people, friendship, and shared purpose. The supper and performance bring that message to life in a way that resonates with everyone, regardless of faith or background.


## CREATION SUNDAY SUNDAY 19TH OCTOBER


### REMEMBERING THOSE WE LOVE...

Each year, we come together at St Laurence Church for our Commemoration of the Departed—a quiet, reflective service to remember and give thanks for the lives of those we have loved and lost. This year, we will gather on Sunday 2nd November at 6pm.

During the service, we will read the names of everyone whose funerals we have taken in the last three years, and light a candle in their memory. There is also the opportunity to add the names of loved ones who have died outside this period, so that all who are dear to us may be remembered.

These moments of remembrance can bring a mixture of emotions— sadness, gratitude, longing, and love. In the midst of this, we are reminded that God holds us tenderly in our grief, offering comfort, presence, and hope. Our gathering provides space to mourn, to reflect, and to celebrate lives lived, knowing that we are not alone.

## TOWER RESTORATION UPDATE BEHIND THE SCAFFOLDING

By the beginning of August virtually all of the defective stonework has been prepared. Stones needing replacement have been measured and cut out. Those which just needed loose surface debris removing have been 'de-frazzed'. Lots or joints have been re-points. All these activities have been a little more extensive than at first hoped.

Some stones which had worked loose over the years have been re-secured with stainless steel dowels and re-pointed in.

As you can imagine, when you get up close you can see more flaws than were originally visible from ground level. This extra work will mean that the total project will take a little longer than first hoped but the extra cost is within the contingency in the budget.

We have found evidence of previous repair works, but have no real clue as to when these happened. But we have found where a previous mason has signed his name on the tower. Whether he was one of the Victorians working on the rebuilding of the church in the 1860s or from some previous repair activity we don't know. Maybe the style of the lettering will give a clue, something to investigate later.





180 pieces of stone have been purchased, some delivered ready to install, some which need shaping to mimic those they are replacing.

Work has started on installing the new roof, to replace the felt roof which was put in as a temporary measure a couple of years ago.

Because the weather has been kind, without any extensive rain, work has been proceeding well. So, despite the additional stones needing work we are still confident of completing the work in time for Heritage Open Day, although it may be touch and go!



## PHILLIPA BRAKES WRITES...

I saw a post in Instagram, or it may have been Facebook which portrayed God, if God existed, as a tyrant who demanded the worship of his followers to build up his own inflated ego. Worse still, he supposedly rejected all those who refused to worship him.

Hmm - where to go with that? It struck me that the basic misunderstanding here is about what worship is for and what it achieves. In earthly terms, if human beings worship another human being, it produces a monster like Hitler because we are not capable to receiving extreme adulation and still remaining rational or compassionate. Come to think of it, some celebrities struggle with the effects of the adoration of their fans. However God is totally different. God is not subject to the inadequacies, pride and selfishness we exhibit. God doesn't actually need our worship or indeed, us at all. Parents don't really need their children, they just want them. With good parents, the love flows in a two way process. Imagine a parent with a toddler at the park. The child will stand on a high surface and say "Catch me". She will then fling herself off knowing her father or mother will catch her. As she flies, she feels exhilaration, a touch of fear of the height and the joy of knowing she will be caught. The parent will revel in the fun, moved by the complete trust of the child. As child and parent connect, joy courses through both and their bond of love and trust is increased and becomes lifelong.

When we worship, offering God our songs and prayers of thankfulness and praise, we are overcome by a sense of utter awe that a being of such power and creativity who brought into being out of love, the world we see around us and so much more, actually loves and is interested in each one of us. When God sees our worship, we are viewed like a loving parent watching a nativity play, proud of their little one's efforts, however failing and hesitant they may be. God can take our pathetic offerings, magnify them and return them to us as joy, hope and peace which we can then spread to others. God doesn't need our worship for himself; God knows it is necessary for us to worship in order to grow into the people we were born to be. Worshipping God helps us to mature and enables us to cope with the difficulties we face in this world. When we see ourselves in relation to the perfection and purity of God, we know we have frequently failed to be the people we should be and yet we are loved and forgiven. This humbles us and should enable us to forgive others who fail; who are we to judge? When we worship with gratitude and wonder, our hearts lift, our mood improves and we are empowered to live our lives to the full.

Also God doesn't actually reject anyone. Jesus never turned away anyone who came to him for healing and help. However, he did allow people to choose to walk away. The rich young man wanted to follow him (Mark chapter 10, verses 17-31) but he wanted his wealth, status and comforts more, so he walked away. God knows that these things will not satisfy us long term, but is willing to wait with infinite patience while we try out everything that isn't God, until we recognise that what we need, more than anything else is just him, no ego, no tyranny, no judgement, just love, pure, simple and eternal.

## CHURCHYARD AND NATURE TRAIL

The hot and dry weather has impacted our gardens and churchyard alike. However, some trees have already fruited and seeded well and others, such as the holly and yew, are displaying their ripening berries. The lime trees are currently laden with seeds, but this year there appear to be fewer acorns on the large oak tree.

For those who have walked in the churchyard in the last few weeks, the cherry plum trees have been full of small but delicious fruit (I can personally vouch for that), and in other areas there are blackberries. I recently inadvertently disturbed a toad, and this and other creatures will soon be preparing for autumn and winter.

Meanwhile work on creating the nature trail continues. Possible sources of funding are being explored, as is the involvement of children from our village schools in the final stages of preparing and displaying information about the flora and fauna that can be seen. Also, two specific areas are being prepared for the process of increasing the number of wildflowers growing in the churchyard, by a winter seeding of yellow rattle, a native pant used in many nature reserves for this purpose.

It is also hoped that bird feeders and nesting boxes will be installed during Autumn, with the intention of increasing the types and numbers of small birds frequenting the area. Increasing wildlife habitats and improving bio-diversity are two of the main goals for creating the Nature Trail.

## A QUIET SPACE TO BE HEARD: PRAYER MINISTRY AT ST LAURENCE

We may not have all the answers. But we offer a listening ear, a safe space, and the kindness of prayer—because that, too, is holy.

So if you're ever in church on a Sunday between the services, and you're wondering whether this quiet corner might be for you—the answer is yes.


